PART 2: LICENCE CONDITIONS

Definitions and matters of general application:

Unless otherwise stated, reference in this licence to EU, Council or Commission Regulations shall be read as reference to those Regulations as they form part of retained EU law which, by virtue of the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018, forms part of UK domestic law and as may subsequently be amended from time to time.

1. VALIDITY

- 1.1. This licence variation shall not authorise fishing anywhere unless the vessel is registered as a fishing vessel under the Merchant Shipping Act 1995, or in the Channel Islands or Isle of Man.
- 1.2. This licence variation shall not authorise fishing anywhere unless the vessel holds a valid licence to fish in United Kingdom waters issued by the Scottish Ministers, Welsh Ministers, the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs in Northern Ireland or the Marine Management Organisation.
- 1.3. Any licence or licence variations in respect of the areas covered by this licence variation previously issued in respect of the above-named vessel, is revoked immediately prior to the point at which this licence variation comes into force.
- 1.4. This licence variation, and any fishing authorisation issued in accordance with Article 7 of Council Regulation (EC) 1224/2009 must be carried on board the vessel and be produced to a Marine Enforcement Officer or British Sea Fishery Officer on demand. This condition may be fulfilled by production of a copy in electronic format.
- 1.5. This licence variation supplements the domestic fishing licence held in respect of the vessel to which it relates. It is not transferrable and will cease to have effect if the UK fishing licence becomes no longer attached to the vessel to which it relates.
- 1.6. In accordance with regulation 3(2)(c)(ii) of the Sea Fishing (Licences and Notices) (Scotland) Regulations 2011⁴, regulation 3(4)(b) of the Sea Fishing (Licences and Notices) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2014⁵ and regulations 3(3)(b) of the Sea Fishing (Licences and Notices) (England) Regulations 2012⁶ and the Sea Fishing (Licences and Notices) (Wales) Regulations 2019⁷ respectively, this external waters licence may be varied by publishing a notice on the following website:

2. PERMITTED CATCHES

- 2.1. The vessel to which this licence variation relates shall not retain on board, land or trans-ship any sea fish of the descriptions set out in paragraphs 1 and 2 of Part 3: Annex to this licence. Any sea fish so caught must be returned to the sea immediately.
- 2.2. Notwithstanding the provisions of condition 2.1, where any sea fish of the descriptions set out in paragraph 2 of Part 3: Annex to this licence is subject to the landing obligation in Article 15 of Regulation (EU) 1380/2013⁸, this licence variation shall not authorise fishing for any sea fish of those descriptions. Any such fish caught shall, in any event, be retained on board, landed and shall count against quota.
- 2.3. The vessel to which this licence variation relates must not retain on board, land or trans-ship, fish in excess of the amounts specified in relation to each such species in paragraph 3 of Part 3: Annex to this licence.
- 2.4. Notwithstanding the provision of condition 2.3, where any sea fish of the descriptions set out in Part 3: Annex paragraph 2 of this licence variation is subject to the landing obligation in Article 15 of Regulation (EU) No 1380/2013 it shall be retained on board, recorded, landed and shall be included in calculating the total amount of fish of that description landed by and attributed to the vessel for the relevant period.
- 2.5. The quantities of fish that may be caught which are set out in in paragraph 3 of Part 3: Annex are cumulative to any fishing which takes place within British fishery limits and catches made outside British fishery limits will count towards the overall quantities of fish the vessel is permitted to catch in both British fishery limits and waters outside those limits.

3. **GENERAL CONDITIONS**

- 3.1. Unless otherwise stated in this licence variation, the conditions which apply to the vessel licence which authorises fishing within British fishery limits apply to this licence variation insofar as the vessel must comply with those conditions whilst operating in the waters to which this licence variation grants access.
- 3.2. The owner and the master and/ or charterer must always comply with the rules applicable to vessels whilst operating in waters over which a country other than the UK has sovereignty or sovereign rights or subject to the measures or recommendations of a regional fisheries management organisation.
- 3.3. Condition 3.1 above is applicable only insofar as the relevant licence conditions are compatible with the rules referred to in condition 3.2. Should any conflict between licence conditions and the rules referred to in condition 3.2 occur, those rules have supremacy.

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4. AREAS IN WHICH YOU MAY NOT FISH

- 4.1. The vessel must not be present in an area as set out below, other than when transiting at a speed of more than six knots (except in the case of force majeure or adverse conditions).
 - a) In the case of force majeure or adverse conditions, the master must immediately inform the UK Fisheries Monitoring Centre.
 - b) Vessels transiting through the areas listed below must ensure that all fishing gear is lashed and stowed in accordance with Article 47 of Council Regulation (EC) 1224/2009⁹ at all times.

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5. MARINE MAMMAL BYCATCH REPORTING

- 5.1. Where the vessel undertakes fishing activities the result of which causes or contributes to the mortality of or injury to any species of marine mammal, or where such species are taken as bycatch (regardless of whether such catches are retained on board) the master, owner, charterer, as appropriate, of the vessel to which this licence relates must complete and submit to the Marine Management Organisation a marine mammal injury reporting form in accordance with the guidance provided at https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/marine-mammal-bycatch-reporting-requirements no later than 48 hours after the vessel returns to port.
- 5.2. For the purposes of this licence condition, the term "marine mammal" means any mammal which (a) is morphologically adapted to the marine environment including sea otters and members of the orders Cetacea (whales, dolphins, and porpoises), Pinnipedia, (walrus, seals and sea lions) and Sirenia (dugongs and manatees), or (b) primarily inhabits the marine environment (such as the polar bear); and includes any part of any such marine mammal, including but not limited to its raw, dressed, or dyed fur or skin.

6. FISHING GEAR AND EQUIPMENT RESTRICTIONS

6.1. The vessel is prohibited from using a collecting bag in the NEAFC Regulatory Area.

7. AREA MANAGEMENT MEASURES FOR THE PROTECTION OF VULNERABLE MARINE ECOSYSTEMS IN THE NEAFC REGULATORY AREA

Existing bottom fishing areas

7.1. In the NEAFC Regulatory Area, it is prohibited to conduct bottom trawling and fishing with static gear, including bottom set gillnets and bottom set longlines, outside the existing bottom fishing areas listed below.

Encounters with possible Vulnerable Marine Ecosystems (VMEs)

- 7.2. The master of a fishing vessel in the course of bottom fishing shall quantify the catches of Vulnerable Marine Ecosystem (VME) indicators where evidence of VMEs is encountered. VME indicators has the same meaning as in UK retained Regulation (EU) 2016/2336 Annex III.
- 7.3. An encounter with a possible VME is defined as:
 - a) for a trawl tow, and fishing gear other than longlines: the presence of more than 30 kg of live coral and/or 400 kg of live sponge of VME indicators; and
 - b) for a longline set: the presence of VME indicators on 10 hooks per caught per 1000 hook segment or per 1200 m section of long line, whichever is the shorter.
- 7.4. Where the quantity of VME indicator species amounts to an encounter in a fishing operation, the master shall:
 - a) if the encounter is discovered in connection with the hauling of trawl gears, cease fishing and move out of an area defined as a 2 nautical mile wide band (polygon) on both sides of the track of the trawl haul during which an encounter occurred; the track is defined as the line joining consecutive VMS positions, supplemented by the most precise available positioning information, between the start and the end of the tow, extended by 2 nautical miles at both ends;
 - b) if the encounter is discovered in connection with other bottom fishing gear, cease fishing and move away at least 2 nautical miles from the position that the evidence suggests is closest to the exact encounter location.
- 7.5. The master shall use all available sources of information and report without delay to UKFMC the details of the incident, including the track or position determined pursuant to condition 7.4, points (a) and (b).
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8. PROHIBITION ON DISCARDS IN THE NEAFC REGULATORY AREA

- 8.1. It is prohibited to discard or release catches from the NEAFC Regulatory Area of the species listed below:

9. LANDING REQUIREMENTS

9.1. If not landing into a UK port, the owner, master and/or charterer, as appropriate, of a fishing vessel shall not commence landing, transhipment or make use of other port services, without prior authorisation granted by the port State; and, the Estimated Time of Arrival (ETA) period, as stated in the prior notification form (PSC1or PSC2), has passed.
