

### CHAPTER CXX.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders made by A.D. 1920. the Minister of Transport under the General Pier and relating to Harwich Llanelly Harbour Act 1861 [4th August 1920.] Newlyn Padstow and Penryn.

MIHEREAS a Provisional Order made by the Minister of Transport under the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 24 & 25 Vict. is not of any validity or force whatever until the confirmation c. 45. thereof by Act of Parliament:

And whereas it is expedient that the several Provisional Orders made by the Minister of Transport under the said Act and set out in the schedule to this Act be confirmed by Act of Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The several Orders as set out in the schedule to this Confirmation Act shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the of Orders in provisions thereof in manner and form as they are set out in the said schedule shall from and after the passing of this Act have full validity and force.

Padstow. Order to revive the powers for the construction and to extend the time for the completion of the works authorised by the Padstow Harbour Order 1913 to increase the tolls reter dues and charges leviable by the Padstow Harbour Commissioners and for other purposes.

Short title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Padstow Harbour Order 1920.

Collective title.

2. The Padstow Harbour Acts and Orders 1844 to 1913 as varied and amended by this Order and this Order may be cited together as the Padstow Harbour Acts and Orders 1844 to 1920.

As from the commencement of this Order the Padstow Harbour Increase of Acts and Orders 1844 to 1913 shall be read and construed as it the tollarce amount, of any toll rate due or other charge which the Commissioners are by those Acts and Orders or any of them authorised to charge in respect of vessels animals goods articles things or commodities were in each case doubled.
- 9. All costs charges and expenses of and incident to the Costs of preparation and obtaining of this Order and otherwise incurred in Order. reference thereto as taxed by the taxing officer of the House of Lords or of the House of Commons shall be paid by the Commissioners out of moneys received by them under the Padstow Harbour Acts and Orders 1844 to 1913 as varied and amended by this Order or out of money borrowed for the purpose.
