




Transforming £385bn per year spend on public procurement

- A simpler, more efficient, modern commercial system
- Opening up public procurement
- Better value for money
- Banning those who pose unacceptable risks
- Embedding transparency
- Fostering innovation
- Maximising social value



Key changes during the procurement process

- Visibility of pipelines and notices including pre-market engagement
- More flexibility in procurement procedures
- Direct Awards in cases of urgency
- Strengthened approach to exclusions and new debarment register
- Supplier feedback requirement on public bodies to provide assessment info for final tenders aims to provide greater consistency of information



Other key changes to watch out for

- Moving from Most Economically Advantageous Tender to Most Advantageous Tender
- In-life Contract Change provisions e.g. more grounds for change
- Publication of Key Performance
 Indicators (for contracts over £5m)
- Provisions for prompt payment, including a 30-day implied term for supply-chain







Competitive Tendering

- Open Procedure
- Competitive Flexible Procedure this could include stages such as the below (but MUST be clear from the tender docs)
 - Commercial Dialogue
 - Negotiation/ BAFO
 - Site visits, supplier presentations
 - Product demonstrations
 - eAuctions
 - Variant Tenders


TO NOTE: for below-threshold procurement, no requirement to use Supplier Information - standard direct awards can continue under threshold.



Frameworks

- A more flexible approach to setting up frameworks
- New Open Frameworks that can be opened for new entrants
- Dynamic Markets for a range of goods and services
- Future development of Register of Commercial
 Tools

IMPORTANT: There is a transition between regimes and call-offs from existing frameworks will continue under the current regime.






The Central Digital Platform

Why is the Central Digital Platform important?

A more open and transparent public procurement regime


- New procurement notices
- Registration service for suppliers to store details
- Unique identifiers
- Built to allow future functionality



Supplier registration starts on 24 February 2025

The Central Digital Platform will cover different aspects

- Enhancement of the existing Find a
 Tender service
- Easier to find and bid for contract and integrated with other systems including eSender platforms
- There is no hurry to get registered
- Registration straightforward and quick
- Videos and user guides to help you on GOV.UK



Procurement Review Unit

The Procurement Review Unit will provide oversight for suppliers

The PRU will have the responsibility of overseeing three key areas within the new regime

Public Procurement Review Service (PPRS)

Enhancing the services offered to suppliers from the PPRS to maintain fairness within the public sector procurement landscape.

Procurement Compliance Service (PCS)

Reviewing contracting authority compliance to the new legislation and making recommendations to address repeated non-compliances.

Debarment Review Service (DRS)

Considering and/or conducting investigations into suppliers where their behaviour or circumstances mean that potentially they should not be allowed to participate in covered procurements or be awarded public contracts.
