### **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: REST DAYS**

We refer to your email dated 19 September 2024 to the Ministry of Defence Police (MDP), which was acknowledged on 20 September 2024.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email you requested the following information:

**How many Rest Days are owed to Constables, Sergeants, Inspectors and Chief Inspectors in your force?**

**Can you give this information as of 1 September 2024?**

**If possible could you give the figures as a total, as well as broken down annually if you have that information? And if you don't have complete numbers for the year, please can you just send what you have as a total**

A search for information has now been completed and the MDP does hold information in scope of your request.

The number of rest days owed are as follows:

Constables - 0

Sergeants - 0

Inspectors - 0

Chief Inspectors - 0

In line with current policy:

Constables and Seargeants - If a rest day is worked within 15 days notice, officers are paid at rest day working rate, rather than being owed a rest day. If a rest day is moved between 15-29 days, the rest day is rerostered, so officers do not lose a rest day and it is not owed.

Inspectors and Chief Inspectors - if a rest day is worked, officers are entitled to Time Off In Lieu (TOIL), rather than being owed a rest day.

If you are not satisfied with the handling of your request, or the content of this response, you can request an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team,
