REQUEST FOR INFORMATION: Figures for dog exemptions and neutering dogs

Thank you for your request for information of 27 September 2024 about the figures for dog exemptions and neutering dogs. We have handled your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Your information request and our response are set out below.

- 1) How many exemptions have been cancelled/void since June 30th Deadline for non compliance
- 2) How many exemptions have been court ordered sine 31st January, 2024?
- 3) How many dogs are due to still be neutered for each deadline
 - December 31st, 2024
 - June 2025

We have reasonably assumed your request relates to XL Bully dogs.

Part 1 of your request

We are still processing neutering forms for XL Bully dogs that were required to be neutered by the 30 June 2024, including working with owners who made minor errors on their forms to ensure all the necessary information is provided and their dog remains exempt. Consequently, at this present moment in time, we do not hold a finalised total for exemptions that have been cancelled/void since 30 June 2024 deadline for non-compliance.

Part 2 of your request

As of the 7 October 2024, 91 certificates of exemption have been issued by Defra, following a court order.

Part 3 of your request

Dogs aged under 12 months on the 31 January 2024 need to be neutered by the 31 December 2024. In March this year, the Government announced that there would be an extension for the youngest dogs that were aged 7 months or less on the 31 January 2024.

These dogs would need to be neutered by the 30 June 2025. There is a total of approximately 6300 dogs that need to be neutered by the 31 December 2024 and 5800 dogs by the 30 June 2025 respectively.

Information disclosed in response to this FOIA request is releasable to the public.
