JUDGMENT

- 1. The claims for unauthorised deduction of wages on 30 December 2022, 11 January 2023 and 18 January 2023 were not presented within the applicable time limit. It was reasonably practicable to do so. The claims for these unauthorised deductions are therefore dismissed. The Tribunal has found the deductions did not form part of a series of deductions with the last in the series being the alleged deduction made on 8 June 2023.
- 2. The claim for unauthorised deductions from wages made on 8 June 2023 (paid on 23 June 2023) is not well founded and is dismissed.
- 3. The consequential claim for unpaid annual leave relating to the unauthorised deduction of wages is therefore not well founded and is dismissed.
- 4. The complaint of being subjected to detriments for making a protected disclosure is not well founded and is dismissed.

This decision was explained orally to the parties at the hearing.
