# How to find alert updates


Different types of alerts can be found across MHRA webpages on GOV.UK. The type of alert you're looking for will determine which page you should access.



- 1. Enter search term (2–3 words maximum)
- 2. Narrow search by date, if known

3. View relevant results from all MHRA pages





#### How to use the filter function

 Filters are available on the left-hand side via a dropdown menu and differ according to the webpage being viewed




2. If on mobile, tap the downward arrow on the lefthand side to see the options



# How to sign up to alerts


It's easy to stay-in-the-know with the latest alerts and safety updates.
