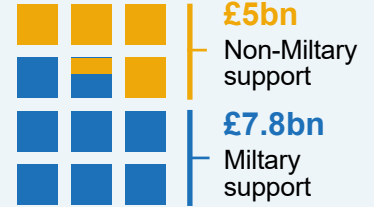




UK Support to Ukraine

Diplomacy

UK-Ukraine [100 Year Partnership](#) fosters cross-sector collaboration incl. defence & security, science & tech, economy & trade [16 Jan]

Supported [UNGA resolutions](#) condemning Russia's: invasion [Feb 25, Feb 23 Mar 22]; attempted annexation of 4 Ukrainian regions [Oct 22]; & attacks on Ukraine's energy infrastructure [Jul 24]

We use the UNSC to hold Russia to account & reaffirm support for Ukraine. FS used Presidency to mark [1000 days of invasion](#) [18 Nov]

At OSCE, we call out Russia weekly & co-fund Support Programme for Ukraine. [4 fact-finding missions](#) reported on human rights abuses.

At [Reinforced Permanent Council](#) we reiterated our support [24 Feb]

At IAEA, we support efforts towards nuclear safety in Ukraine

Military

£7.8bn total & [£3bn a year](#) for as long as it takes [10 Jul]

[£2.26bn](#) contribution to G7 ERA Loans, to be repaid with profits from Russian assets. Legislation has now received Royal Assent [16 Jan]

UK therefore expects to provide [£4.5bn](#) total support in 2025 [16 Jan]

Sent approx. 400 different capabilities to Ukraine incl. new [£150m](#) package incl. drones, tanks & air defence, [£225m](#) package incl. drones, boats & munitions [19 Dec], & [650 LMM missiles](#) [6 Sep]

UK & Latvia-led drone coalition to deliver [30,000](#) new attack & surveillance drones [9 Jan]. UK invested [£7.5m](#) [19 Nov]

UK & Denmark joint-funding bespoke [air defence system](#) [16 Jan]

[UK/Ukraine Defence Industrial Support Treaty](#) expands list of military equipment that can be funded via £3.5bn UK Export Finance [19 Jul]

Op INTERFLEX: >51,000 Ukr personnel trained; Op [extended](#) in 2025 [6 Sep] & 180 soldiers to get [combat mental resilience training](#) [28 Dec]

[£20m](#) for Project Renovator supports wounded Ukr troops [24 Feb]

UK-administered International Fund for Ukraine procures equipment: [>£1.3bn](#) pledged to date, incl. [£300m ammunition order](#) [10 Jul]

Non-military

£5bn in non-military commitments since Feb 22. This includes:

- [£4.1bn](#) in fiscal support through World Bank loan guarantees
- [£977m](#) in bilateral assistance. [£282m](#) in 2024/25 funds reform, humanitarian, energy, recovery & reconstruction programmes

Humanitarian

[£477m](#) total assistance to Ukraine and the region, incl. [at least £120m](#) in humanitarian assistance in 2024/25 [11 Sep]

[£15m](#) will support those most in need this winter [17 Dec]

We have committed £12.9 million to HALO Trust for demining, incl. [£4.3m](#) for 2025/26. Over 495,000m² land cleared (May 22 to Dec 24)

Recovery & Reconstruction

Co-hosted [Ukraine Recovery Conference 2023](#), raising over \$60bn

[War risk insurance](#) via MIGA & [EBRD](#) boosts inward investment [>£500m](#) via UKEF for reconstruction, energy & defence projects

Up to [£30m](#) via British International Investment, working with [EBRD](#) to offer trade finance to support critical imports/exports. [11 Sep]

£38m Good Governance Fund tackles corruption & supports reform

New [£50m](#) economic recovery programme helps SMEs [16 Jan]

Energy

Over £400m for energy security and resilience through grant, in-kind support and loan guarantees

A further [£20m](#) to support emergency energy needs takes total support to the Ukraine Energy Support Fund to £84m [17 Dec]

[£181m](#) from UKEF for Urenco to supply enriched uranium to power Ukraine & maintain its independence from Russian fuel [18 Jul]

[£17m](#) to support UK and Ukrainian innovators through a second round of UK's Innovate Ukraine Green Energy Competition [5 Feb]

Sanctions

>2,200 individuals and entities sanctioned, incl. >2,000 since full-scale invasion

UK, US and EU sanctions have deprived Russia of over \$450bn since Feb 2022 - equivalent to ~3 more years funding for the invasion

Sanctions have plunged Russia's \$10bn investment in its shadow fleet into crisis & left vessels unable to trade. 129 oil tankers, 9 LNG carriers & 7 vessels transporting military goods sanctioned since July

Sanctions are increasing costs & delays and reducing quality - cost of components for the Russian defence sector are up 30%

This Government has imposed sanctions against:

- [over 100 targets, incl. 40 oil tankers & military supply chains](#) - our largest package in over 2 years [24 Feb]

- several high-profile individuals linked to [Putin's inner circle](#) [14 Feb]

- [2 of Russia's 4 largest oil companies](#), disrupting revenues [10 Jan]

[£4.5m](#) new funding to support Ukraine's domestic war crimes investigations - total funding now £10.7m [29 Dec]

Additional [£2.3m](#) to the International Criminal Court

Active member of the '[core group](#)' scoping options for achieving accountability for the crime of aggression

Founding member of the [International Register of Damage](#) to support claims by Ukrainians who have suffered losses as a result of the war

Trade

The UK-Ukraine [Digital Trade Agreement](#) entered into force [1 Sep]

The UK-Ukraine [TechBridge](#) delivers projects in mutual trade, investment, innovation research and digital skills development

Our [City-Ukraine Hub](#) leverages UK expertise to deliver capacity building projects

Our military aid and insurance through the UK-developed [Unity facility](#) supported the Black Sea [maritime corridor](#) enabling Ukraine to [export](#) its goods, including all of its 2023 harvest.

UK-Ukraine Political, Free Trade & Strategic Partnership Agreement enables [tariff free trade on all goods](#) until 31 March 2029 (eggs & poultry until 31 March 2026) [8 Feb 2024]

Ukrainians in the UK

[219,400](#) Ukrainians have arrived in the UK, including 160,500 via Homes for Ukraine [as of 30 Dec]

[Ukraine Permission Extension Scheme](#) opened 4 Feb 2025 [26 Nov]
