







The UK ETS Authority has published a consultation on extending the scheme beyond its current legislated phase, which ends in 2030. Extending the scheme from 2031 onwards will ensure that participants within the Scheme continue to be subject to their compliance obligations, that greenhouse gas emissions covered by the Scheme remain capped, and that emissions allowances can continue to be traded. This will provide certainty for participants and maintain the incentive to decarbonise their operations by investing in sustainable technologies.

The Authority's intention is to continue the UK ETS beyond its current legislated phase and legislate for this when parliamentary time allows, as set out in the Authority's December 2023 Long Term Pathway for the UK ETS. This consultation is a necessary step towards fulfilling that commitment, and asks for views on the extension of the scheme.

The Authority is also seeking views on some of the key features of Phase II of the UK ETS:

- The Authority proposes to extend the scheme's existing flexibility provisions to allow the banking of emissions allowances between Phase I and the proposed Phase II and asks for views on this.
- 2. The consultation also seeks stakeholder views on options for the length of the proposed Phase II.

The Authority also sets out its intention to consult on a proposed cap trajectory beyond 2030 following the setting of Carbon Budget 7 in Summer 2026 and to respond to this consultation as soon as possible, to give participants certainty over the future UK ETS cap.
