JUDGMENT

The Employment Judge gave Judgment as follows:

1. The Respondent has made an unlawful deduction of wages and is ordered to pay the Claimant **£3,294.72 gross**.
2. The Claimant was dismissed in breach of contract in respect of notice and the Respondent is ordered to pay compensation to the Claimant in **the sum of £366.08**.
3. The Respondent has failed to pay to the Claimant his holiday entitlement and is ordered to pay to the Claimant **the sum of £366.08**.
4. The total amount payable by the Respondent **to the Claimant is £4,026.88**.
