

General Licence – Publication Notice

General licence - INT/2022/2085212

OFSI has the power to issue General Licences for country sanctions regimes under the Sanctions and Anti-Money Laundering Act 2018 ("the Sanctions Act").

On 15 August 2022, OFSI issued General Licence INT/2022/2085212 under Regulation 64 of the Russia (Sanctions) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019 ("the Russia Regulations") to allow payments to a Sanctioned Bank or any Subsidiary for the purpose of making energy available for use in Mongolia. Any persons intending to use General Licence INT/2022/2085212 should consult the copy of the Licence on this page for full details of the permissions and usage requirements.

For the purposes of General Licence INT/2022/2085212 the Sanctioned Banks means:

- Credit Bank of Moscow;
- Gazprombank;
- Sberbank; and
- Rosbank PJSC TBank.

A Subsidiary is any entity owned or controlled by a Sanctioned Bank.

A Person is an individual, a body of persons corporate or unincorporate, any organisation or any association or combination of persons; and a Relevant Institution is:

- A person that has permission under Part 4A of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000(3) (permission to carry on regulated activity).
- A person that is authorised or registered under Part 2 of the Payment Services Regulations (SI 2017/752).
- A person that is authorised or registered under Part 2 of the Electronic Money Regulations (SI 2011/99).
- A person that is a "recognised clearing house", "third country central counterparty", "recognised CSD" or "third country CSD" for the purposes of s.285 of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000.
- A person that is an operator of a recognised payment system (or that is a service provider in relation to recognised payment systems) for the purposes of Part 5 of the Banking Act 2009.

Under General Licence INT/2022/2085212 a Person may continue to make payments to a Sanctioned Bank or any Subsidiary for the purpose of making energy available for use in Mongolia, and a Person, Relevant Institution, Sanctioned Bank or Subsidiary can carry out any activity reasonably necessary to effect this.

On 24 March 2025, General Licence INT/2022/2085212 was amended such that:

- Rosbank PJSC has been removed from the definition of Sanctioned Banks; and
- TBank has been added to the definition of Sanctioned Banks.

General

The permissions in General Licence INT/2022/2085212 do not authorise any act which the person carrying out the act knows, or has reasonable grounds for suspecting, will result in funds or economic resources being dealt with or made available in breach of The Russia Regulations, save as permitted under licences granted under the Russia Regulations.

General Licence INT/2022/2085212 took effect from 15 August 2022. On 27 July it was extended and now expires at 23:59 on 14 August 2025.
