DECLARATION OF SPECIAL MEASURES: FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE IMPORTATION OF UNTREATED WOOL AND HAIR OF SUSCEPTIBLE ANIMALS FROM CERTAIN THIRD COUNTRIES AND TERRITORIES THE TRADE IN ANIMALS AND RELATED PRODUCTS (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2012

The Scottish Ministers have reasonable grounds for suspecting the existence of foot and mouth disease in relevant countries and territories, such that certain animal byproducts originating in those countries and territories are liable to pose a risk to animal health.

Under regulation 25(1) of the Trade in Animals and Related Products (Scotland) Regulations 2012<sup>1</sup>, Scottish Ministers declare the following special measures to be necessary in Scotland in order to contain the risk to animal health:

### Suspension of entry into Scotland

- **1.** Entry into Scotland is suspended for the following animal by-products of susceptible animals originating from relevant countries and territories:
  - a) untreated wool; and
  - b) untreated hair.
- 2. If the untreated wool or hair referred to in paragraph 1 originates from an FMD-free zone listed in Annex 2 to this Declaration, they must be accompanied by a completed health certificate using the model provided in Annex 3 to this Declaration.

### Interpretation

- 3. In this Declaration:
  - a) "relevant countries and territories" means all countries and territories except the countries and territories listed in Annex 1 to this Declaration, or FMD-free zones listed in Annex 2 to this Declaration;
  - b) "untreated wool" and "untreated hair" have the same meanings as in Annex I to Commission Regulation (EU) No 142/2011 implementing Regulation (EC) No 1069/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down health rules as regards animal by-products and derived products not intended for human consumption and implementing Council Directive 97/78/EC as regards

- certain samples and items exempt from veterinary checks at the border under that Directive<sup>2</sup>; and
- c) "susceptible animals" means a cow, bull, sheep, goat, deer, camel, llama, alpaca, guanaco, vicuna, any other ruminant, or elephant.

# **Revocation of previous measures**

**4.** The "Declaration of Special Measures: Foot and Mouth Disease, Importation of Untreated Wool and Hair of Susceptible Animals From Certain Third Countries and Territories" made by Scottish Ministers on 24 March 2025 is revoked.

## **Duration of Special Measures**

**5.** The revocation in paragraph 4 and the special measures in this Declaration apply from the beginning of the day after the day on which this Declaration is made until this Declaration is revoked or amended by a further declaration.
