RA 3224 – UK Flight Information Services ▶ and North Atlantic Treaty Organization Control Rules ◀

Rationale

► Controllers and Flight Information Service Officers (FISOs) are required to provide a range of services in order to maintain a safe and expeditious flow of air traffic. Without a standardized system to deliver these services across different airspace, a key Safety barrier is eroded. UK Flight Information Services (FIS) and North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) Control Rules enable a standardized delivery of control services. ◀

Regulation 3224(1)

UK Flight Information Services

3224(1) ► Aviation Duty Holder

► Aviation Duty Holder-Facing Organizations and Accountable Manager (Military Flying) – Facing Organizations (AA-Facing Organizations) **shall** provide Air Systems with UK FIS appropriate to the airspace classification of the UK Flight Information Region (FIR) in which the Air Systems are operating. ◀

Regulation 3224(2)

▶ North Atlantic Treaty Organization Control Rules

3224(2) AA-Facing Organizations **shall** ensure that NATO Control Rules are provided iaw airspace and operating requirements. ◀

Acceptable Means of Compliance 3224(2)

► North Atlantic Treaty Organization Control Rules

- 5. NATO Control Rules **should** be provided:
 - a. Only by personnel that are suitably trained and authorized to do so.
 - b. law Allied Tactical Publication (ATP) 3.3.5.1¹. ◀

6. Where provision of UK FIS are not applicable, authorized units² may provide NATO Control Rules as defined in ATP 3.3.5.1¹ in conjunction with Allied Joint Publication (AJP) 3.3.5³. NATO Control Rules are categorized by Mission Control and Safety Service, and the qualification criteria for Controllers authorized to provide them are laid down in the following documents:
