### Introduction

Mexico is located in the southernmost part of North America, bordered by the United States of America to the north and Belize and Guatemala to the south. Mexico has coastline on the Pacific Ocean to the west, the Gulf of Mexico to the east, and the Caribbean Sea to the southeast.

During the colonial era (1521–1821) Mexico was known as New Spain. It achieved independence from Spain in 1821 and is now a Federal Republic. The name Mexico comes from the pre-Colombian name for the area around Mexico City, which was the former Aztec capital Tenochtitlan.

### Geographical names policy and sources

PCGN policy for geographical names in Mexico is to use official sources from the country, retaining any special letters and diacritical marks. Geographical names on official Mexican sources will be written according to Spanish orthography.

The *Instituto Nacional de Estadística y Geografía* (INEGI) serves as Mexico's geographical names authority<sup>5</sup>. An online database of geographical names is available at:

INEGI also maintains the [Norma Técnica de Nombres Geográficos Continentales e Insulares de México](#), a reference document that serves as a technical standard for the compilation and standardization of geographical names of Mexico. The *Archivo histórico de localidades*<sup>6</sup> displays historical and variant names of populated places and can also be a helpful resource for geographical names.

Some Mexican states and populated places may have both short and long forms of their names, e.g. Estado de Michoacán de Ocampo/Estado de Michoacán; San Francisco de Campeche/Campeche. Both forms are official and either can be used. The long form can be used if more specificity is required.

## Languages

The Constitution of Mexico does not declare an official language, however Spanish (ISO 693-3: *spa*) serves as the *de facto* official language of Mexico. Additionally, numerous Indigenous languages are spoken in Mexico, over 60 of which are recognized by the Mexican government as national languages.

The first Law of the Linguistic Rights of Indigenous Peoples (*spa: Ley General de Derechos Lingüísticos de los Pueblos Indígenas*) came into effect in March 2003, officially protecting Indigenous languages, and recognising them as part of the national cultural and linguistic heritage. Updated versions of the law have been published with the most recent being October 2023<sup>7</sup>.

Many of Mexico's toponyms have their origins in the country's Indigenous languages. These names have usually been written according to Spanish orthography.

Some of the most widely-spoken Indigenous languages (those estimated to have 500,000 or more speakers) can be found in the table below. ## Administrative structure

At the first-order administrative division (ADM1) level, Mexico is divided into 31 states (spa: estado) and 1 federal entity (spa: entidad federal)<sup>9</sup>. Each state is officially called ‘the Free and Sovereign State of...’ (spa: Estado Libre y Soberano de...), but this is usually shortened to ‘Estado de...’.
