An Act for the Construction of an Embankment. Docks, and other Works, and the Reclamation and Acquisition of Lands near Fleetwood in the County Palatine of Lancaster; and for other [14th July 1864.] Purposes.

HEREAS the Construction of Docks and other Works connected therewith in that Part of the Estuary of the River Wyre in the County of Lancaster, known as Kirkscar Bay, would be of great public and local Advantage: And whereas the Construction of the said Docks and Works would be facilitated if Powers were granted for the Construction of an Embankment and other Works for more effectually and speedily reclaiming a Portion of the Lands within Kirkscar Bay: And whereas Plans and Sections of the intended Embankment, Docks, and other Works. showing the Situation and Levels thereof respectively, and the Lands which the Company are by this Act empowered to take, and a Book of Reference to such Plans, have been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Lancaster: And whereas it is expedient that a Company be incorporated for carrying this Act into execution: And whereas Sir Peter Hesketh Fleetwood Baronet is or claims to

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be the Owner of the Soil of Kirkscar Bay aforesaid, and is now proceeding in the Execution of Works for reclaiming the Lands within the same, and it is expedient that the said Sir Peter Hesketh Fleetwood and the Company incorporated by this Act should be empowered to enter into Agreements with reference to the Completion, Maintenance, Repair, and Regulation of the said Works, and for the Transfer from Time to Time to the Company of such Parts of the Lands so to be reclaimed as may be agreed upon and as the Company are not by this Act expressly authorized to acquire: And whereas it is expedient that the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company should be empowered to subscribe towards and take Shares in the Capital of the Company by this Act incorporated, and to raise Money for the Purpose: And whereas it is expedient that the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, and the London and Northwestern Railway Company, and the Company hereby incorporated should be empowered to enter into Arrangements as in this Act provided: And whereas the Persons herein-after named, with others, are willing to carry such Undertaking into execution, but the same cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; (that is to say,)

Short Title.

1. In citing this Act for any Purpose it shall be sufficient to use the Expression "The Fleetwood Docks Act, 1864."

Interpretation of Terms.

- 2. The following Words and Expressions shall have in this Act the Meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, unless there be something in the Subject or Context repugnant to such Construction; (that is to say,)
 - The Expression "the Company" shall mean the Company incorporated by this Act:
 - The Expression "the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company" shall mean the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company:
 - The Expression "the Two Companies" shall mean the Lancashire and Yorkshire and London and North-western Railway Companies:
 - The Expression "the Dock" shall mean the Dock and the Works of the Company to be constructed under the Powers of this Act in connexion with the said Dock:
 - The Expression "Superior Courts," or "Court of competent Jurisdiction," or any other like Expression in this Act or any Act incorporated herewith, shall be read and have effect as if the Debt or Demand with respect to which the Expression is used were a common Simple Contract Debt and not a Debt or Demand created by Statute.

3. The several Acts of Parliament following; (that is to say,) 8 & 9 Vict. "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," "The Lands cc. 16 & 18. 10 & 11 Vict. Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1860," and "The Harbours, Docks, and 23 & 24 Vict. Piers Clauses Act, 1847," except in so far as the same are excepted corporated. or varied by this Act, shall be incorporated with and form Part of this Act: Provided nevertheless, that the Provisions with respect to Lifeboats, and with respect to keeping a Tide and Weather Gauge, of "The Harbours, Docks, and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," shall not be in force for the Purposes of this Act, except so far as from Time to Time the Board of Trade by Notice in Writing to the Company may require them to provide any Works or Conveniences according to those Provisions respectively.

4. Sir Peter Hesketh Fleetwood Baronet, George Swainson, John Subscribers Hawkins, Thomas Dugdale, George Wilson, John Robinson Kay, and James Holme, and all other Persons and Corporations who have already subscribed or shall hereafter subscribe to the Undertaking, and their Executors, Administrators, Successors, and Assigns respectively, shall be united into a Company for the Purpose of making and maintaining the Docks, Piers, and Works hereby authorized, with all proper Works and Conveniences connected therewith, according to the Provisions of the incorporated Acts and of this Act; and for the Purposes aforesaid and the other Purposes of this Act such Company shall be incorporated by the Name of "The Fleetwood Docks Company," and by that Name shall be a Body Corporate, with perpetual Succession and a Common Seal, and shall have Power to purchase and hold Lands for the Purposes of the Undertaking, subject to the Restrictions and Provisions herein and in the incorporated Acts contained.

- 5. The Capital of the Company shall be Two hundred thousand Capital. Pounds.
- 6. The Number of Shares into which the said Capital shall be Shares. divided shall be Ten thousand, and the Amount of each Share shall be Twenty Pounds.
- 7. It shall not be lawful for the Company to issue any Share Shares not created under the Authority of this Act, nor shall any Share vest in to issue the Person accepting the same unless and until a Sum not being less Fifth part than One Fifth Part of the Amount of such Share shall have been paid paid up. in respect thereof.
- 8. Two Pounds Ten Shillings per Share shall be the greatest Calls. Amount of any One Call which the Company may make upon the Shareholders,

Shareholders, and Three Months at the least shall intervene between successive Calls, and Four Fifths of the Amount of a Share shall be the utmost aggregate Amount of the Calls made in any One Year.

Power to borrow on Mortgage.

9. The Company may borrow on Mortgage any Sums not exceeding in the whole Sixty-six thousand six hundred and sixty-five Pounds, but no Part of such Sum of Sixty-six thousand six hundred and sixty-five Pounds shall be borrowed until the whole of the Sum of Two hundred thousand Pounds shall have been subscribed for, and One Half thereof shall have been actually paid up, and until the Company shall prove to the Justice who is to certify, under the Provisions contained in the Fortieth Section of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," before he so certifies, that Shares for all such Capital have been issued and accepted, and that not less than One Fifth Part of the Amount thereof has been paid on account of each separate Share before or at the Time of the Issue or Acceptance thereof, and that such Shares were issued bona fide, and are held by Subscribers or their Assigns, and for which such Subscribers or their Assigns are legally liable.

Application of Monies.

10. All Monies raised under the Powers of this Act by Shares or borrowing shall be applied only to the Purposes by this Act autho-

Power to Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company to subscribe.

11. The Lancashire and Yorkshire Company may from Time to Time, with the Consent of Three Fifths at least of the Votes of the Proprietors in that Company present, personally or by proxy, at a Meeting specially convened for the Purpose, subscribe to and become Shareholders in the Company to any Extent not exceeding Fifty-one thousand Pounds, and in respect of such Subscription of Fifty-one thousand Pounds the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company shall be represented at the Board of the Company in manner herein-after mentioned.

Lancashire and Yorkshire Company not to dispose of Shares acquired by them.

- 12. The Lancashire and Yorkshire Company shall not at any Time hereafter dispose of or transfer any Shares in the Company acquired by them under the Provisions of this Act.
- 13. And whereas the Preston and Wyre Railway which will pany and the communicate with the Docks by this Act authorized is vested in the Lancashire Lancashire and Yorkshire and London and North-western Railway Companies in the following Proportions; (that is to say,) Two Thirds in the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company and One Third in the London and North-western Railway Company: Therefore, if the London and North-western Railway Company shall at any Time within Six Months after the passing of this Act signify in Writing

under the Hand of their Secretary their Desire to become Share- Subscribers holders in the Company to the Extent of Seventeen thousand Pounds, to Underand the Intention of the London and North-western Railway Company to apply to Parliament for Powers for effecting such Object, the Company and the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company shall consent to their becoming Shareholders to that Extent, and shall and they are hereby required to concur in such Application to Parliament, and to consent to such Alterations being made in the Powers by this Act granted to the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company of subscribing to the Capital of the Company, of appointing Directors of the Company, and otherwise in relation thereto as shall be necessary for enabling the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company and the London and North-western Railway Company respectively to acquire such a relative Interest in the Undertaking of the Company as they respectively now have in the Preston and Wyre Railway, upon equal Terms and Conditions, except as to the Amount of their respective Subscriptions.

14. The Lancashire and Yorkshire Company from Time to Time Power for may raise by the Creation and Issue of Shares for the Purposes of Lancashire their Subscription to the Undertaking by this Act authorized, any Yorkshire Sum not exceeding Fifty-one thousand Pounds, exclusive of the Company to Monies which they are or may be authorized to raise by any other raise Capital for such Act or Acts of Parliament, and may create and issue such Shares Purpose. either wholly or partially as Ordinary or wholly or partially as Preferential Shares, as they may think fit; and Part II., relating to additional Capital of "The Companies Clauses Act, 1863," shall apply to the new Shares so to be created by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company so far as the Provisions thereof are applicable and are not altered or varied by this Act, and all and every Part of the Sum so raised shall be applied to the Purpose of the said Subscription, and to no other Purpose: Provided always, that no Share shall be issued by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company under this Act, or shall vest in the Person accepting the same, unless and until a Sum not less than One Fifth Part of the Amount of such Share shall have been paid in respect thereof.

15. Except as by or under the Powers of this Act otherwise Qualificaprovided the new Shares issued by the Lancashire and Yorkshire tions of new Shares Company under the Powers of this Act, shall, in proportion to the created by aggregate Amount thereof from Time to Time held by the same Lancashire Person at the same Time, entitle the respective Holders thereof to shire Comthe same Dividends and Profits and confer on them the like Qualifi- pany. cations and the like Rights of voting, as the like Amount of existing Ordinary Shares or Stock of that Company.

Power for Lancashire and Yorkshire Company to raise Capital under any other Act of this Session and this Act, by new Shares of One Class.

16. If by any other Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, whether before or after the passing of this Act, the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company be authorized to raise any Capital by new Shares, then, subject to the Provisions of the other Act and this Act respectively, that Company, if they think fit, may raise by the Creation and Issue of new Shares of One and the same Class all or any Part of the aggregate Capital which they are by the other Act and this Act respectively authorized to raise by the Creation and Issue of new Shares.

Extending certain Provisions of 8 & 9 Vict. c. 16., and existing Acts of Lancashire and Yorkshire Company, to new Capital.

- 17. Subject to the Provisions of this Act, all the Provisions of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and of the existing Acts of the *Lancashire and Yorkshire* Company, with respect to the following Matters; (that is to say,)
 - "With respect to the Distribution of the Capital of the Company into Shares;"
 - "With respect to the Transfer or Transmission of Shares;"
 - "With respect to the Payment of Subscriptions and the Means of enforcing the Payment of Calls;"
 - "With respect to the Forfeiture of Shares for Nonpayment of Calls, and the Merger and Re-issue of forfeited Shares;"
 - "With respect to the Remedies of Creditors of the Company against the Shareholders;"
 - "With respect to the Consolidation of Shares into Stock;" and
 - "With respect to the Provision to be made for affording Access to the Special Act by all Parties interested;"

shall be applicable to the Capital by this Act authorized to be raised by the *Lancashire and Yorkshire* Company by Shares and to the Proprietors thereof.

Power to Lancashire and Yorkshire Company to appoint Persons to vote.

18. The Directors of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company may, when and so long as that Company continue Shareholders in the Undertaking of the Company, appoint some Person or Persons (whether a Shareholder or Shareholders in the Company or not), to vote at any Meeting of the Company on behalf of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company, and may from Time to Time revoke any such Appointment and appoint any other Person in that Behalf, and any Person so for the Time being holding such Appointment shall have the same Right of voting at any such Meeting as he would have had if he held in his own Right the Shares in the said Undertaking in respect of which he shall have been appointed to vote, without Prejudice to any Right of voting to which he may be entitled in respect of any Shares held by him in his own Right.

Number of Directors.

19. The Number of Directors shall be Ten, of whom Four shall be appointed by the Directors of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company

Company out of their own Body, and the Remainder by the Shareholders in the Company, inclusive of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company.

20. Sir Peter Hesketh Fleetwood Baronet, George Swainson, First Direc-John Hawkins, Richard Carr, Thomas Barnes M.P., John Robinson Kay (representing the Shareholders), and James Holme, Thomas Dugdale, George Wilson, and Henry Wickham Wickham (representing the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company) shall be the First Directors of the Company.

21. The Directors appointed by this Act, save such of them as Election of may have been appointed by or on behalf of the Lancashire and Directors at Yorkshire Company under the Provisions of this Act, shall continue Ordinary in Office until the First Ordinary Meeting to be held in the Year Meeting. One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and at such Meeting the Shareholders present, personally or by proxy, may either continue in Office such Directors as aforesaid, or any of them, or may elect new Directors to supply the Places of those not continued in Office, the Directors appointed by this Act being eligible for Re-election.

22. At the First Ordinary Meeting to be held in each Year after Subsequent the Year in which such last-mentioned Directors shall have been Election of Directors. appointed or elected, the Shareholders present, personally or by proxy, shall elect Persons to supply the Places of the Directors then retiring from Office, agreeably to the Provisions in "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," and this Act contained; and the several Persons elected at any such Meeting, being neither removed nor disqualified nor having resigned, shall continue to be Directors until others are elected in their Stead in manner provided by "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845."

23. The Directors named in this Act as representing the Lanca- Appointshire and Yorkshire Company shall respectively remain in Office until ment of they shall respectively die, or resign, or become disqualified by ceasing Lancashire to be Directors of that Company, or from any other Cause, or until and they be removed by the Directors of that Company; and it shall be Company. lawful for the Directors of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company, as and when any Vacancy shall occur in the Number of Directors named in this Act as representing that Company, to elect any other Member of their Body in the room of the Director occasioning such Vacancy, and so from Time to Time as any future Vacancy shall occur in the Number of any future Directors appointed by the Directors of that Company; and in the event of any of the Directors named in this Act as representing the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company, or of any of the Directors hereafter appointed by that Company,

Company, being unable from any Cause to attend any Meeting of the Directors of the Company hereby incorporated, it shall be lawful for the Directors of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company to nominate another Director for the Occasion out of their own Body to attend such Meeting, and such Director shall have the same Powers at such Meeting as the Director in whose Stead he may be nominated would have had.

Evidence of Appointment.

24. Every Appointment, Revocation, and Removal by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company of any Person to vote on their Behalf, or of any Director, shall be evidenced by an Instrument in Writing under the Common Seal of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company, which shall be delivered to the Company and kept with their Records, and shall be at all reasonable Times open to the Inspection and Transcription of all Parties interested, and every such Instrument shall as between the Company and the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company be sufficient Evidence of the Facts therein

Rotation of Directors not applicable to Lancashire and Yorkshire Company's Directors.

25. The Provisions of "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," with respect to the Retirement from Office of the Directors, shall only apply to the Directors appointed by the Shareholders, and not to the Directors appointed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company.

Qualification

26. The Qualification of a Director of the Company, other than of Directors. those appointed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Company, shall be the Possession in his own Right of Twenty-five Shares in the Undertaking of the Company.

Quorum.

27. The Quorum of a Meeting of Directors shall be Four.

First Meeting.

28. The First Ordinary Meeting of the Company shall be held within Six Months next after the passing of this Act.

Quorum of General Meeting.

29. The Quorum for every General Meeting of the Company shall be Eight Shareholders, holding in the aggregate not less than Five thousand Pounds in the Capital of the Company.

Shareholders may require an Extraordinary Meeting.

30. The Number of Shareholders who shall be competent to require the Directors to call an Extraordinary Meeting of the Company, or who, in default thereof, shall be competent to call such Meeting, shall be Ten Shareholders holding in the aggregate not less than Ten thousand Pounds in the Capital of the Company.

- 31. Each Shareholder shall have One Vote in respect of each Scale of Share held by him.
- 32. The Lancashire and Yorkshire Company, so long as they As to Rights continue Shareholders in the Company, shall have and be entitled to of Lancathe same Rights of voting and other Rights and Privileges as other Yorkshire Shareholders in the Undertaking, provided that they shall not be Company. entitled to receive any Dividend on the Shares held by them in the Undertaking until the Profits of the Undertaking available for Dividend shall be sufficient, in any One Half Year, for the Payment of a Dividend at the Rate of Five Pounds per Centum per Annum to all the other Shareholders in the Company on the Amount for the Time being paid up on their respective Shares; and thenceforth and for ever thereafter the Profits of the Company available for Dividend shall be divided rateably amongst all the Shareholders in the Company in proportion to the Amount for the Time being called and paid up on their respective Shares.

33. The Newspaper in which Advertisements relating to the Newspaper Affairs of the Company are to be inserted shall be some Newspaper for Adveror Newspapers circulated in the County Palatine of Lancaster.

34. Subject to the Provisions of this Act and the Acts wholly Power to or partially incorporated herewith, the Company from Time to Time take Lands. may enter upon, take, and use all or any of the Lands shown on the deposited Plans within the Limits defined on those Plans as "Limits of Land to be acquired" and described in the Books of Reference thereto.

35. Subject to the Provisions in this Act and the Acts wholly Power to or partially incorporated herewith, the Company may execute the construct Works. Works and effect the Objects following; (that is to say,)

They may construct in the Line or Situation shown on the deposited Plans, or within the Limits of Deviation defined thereon, and according to the Levels shown on the deposited Sections, an Embankment from the original Line of the Preston and Wyre Railway to the present Line of that Railway, and may reclaim and appropriate the Lands lying between the said Embankment and an Embankment known as Denham's Bank:

They may construct the Docks and other Works connected therewith in the Line or Situation shown on the deposited Plans, or within the Limits of Deviation defined thereon, and according to the Levels shown on the deposited Sections, together with all such Locks, Gates, Cuts, Basins, Graving Docks, Sluices, Dams, Piers, Jetties, Yards, Wharfs, Warehouses, Staiths, Drops, Slips, Stairs, Walls, Approaches, Tramways, Works, and Con-[Local.] 28 Q veniences

veniences connected therewith as the Company from Time to Time think fit:

They may from Time to Time, as occasion may require, dredge and deepen the River Wyre between the Entrance to the said Dock and Cansh otherwise Canshe Hole:

They may from Time to Time appropriate and adapt such Parts as they think fit of the Lands acquired by them under the Provisions of this Act for the Purpose of Shipbuilding and other Yards, Manufactories, and other Purposes, and may lease the same for such Terms and for such Rent or other Consideration as they think fit, or may absolutely sell and dispose of the same.

Power to deviate to the Extent marked on Plans. 36. It shall be lawful for the Company in constructing the Docks, Piers, and other Works, to deviate to the Extent of the Limits of Deviation marked on the deposited Plans, and to deviate from the Levels shown on the deposited Sections to any Extent not exceeding Five Feet.

Power to agree with Owner of reclaimed Lands.

37. The Company may from Time to Time enter into and carry into effect, and from Time to Time vary and alter Arrangements and Agreements with Sir Peter Hesketh Fleetwood Baronet, or others, the Owners for the Time being of the Lands now in course of Reclamation as aforesaid, with reference to the Completion and future Maintenance and Repair of the Embankment now in course of Construction for reclaiming the said Lands, and may either alone or in conjunction with the said Sir Peter Hesketh Fleetwood, or other such Owners as aforesaid, complete, maintain, and repair the said Embankment, and may also from Time to Time enter into and carry into effect Contracts or Agreements with the said Sir Peter Hesketh Fleetwood, or other such Owners as aforesaid, for the Acquisition by the Company of such Parts of the said Lands as may from Time to Time be mutually agreed upon, and for the vesting of the same in the Company at and for such Price or other Consideration, and on such Terms and Conditions, and subject to such Covenants and Stipulations as may be mutually agreed upon.

Warehouses licensed as Bonding Warehouses may be used accordingly. Gates and Doors of Warehouses to be secured.

- 38. The Company may at their Discretion use as a Bonding Warehouse any of their Warehouses or any Part thereof which may be duly licensed to be used as such.
- 39. The Gates and Doors of all Warehouses belonging to the Company in which Goods prohibited to be used for Home Consumption, or liable to the Duties of Customs or Excise, may be deposited shall, if required by the Commissioners of Customs or Inland Revenue, be secured in such Manner as shall be approved by such Commissioners.

40. The

40. The Company may give such Bonds or Securities under Board may their Common Seal as may be required by the Laws for the Time give Security for Bondingbeing in force relating to Bonding Warehouses and Bonding Yards.

42. Nothing in this Act shall repeal, alter, or take away any of Saving the Powers conferred on the Fleetwood Improvement Commissioners by "The Fleetwood Improvement Act, 1842," except so far as relates Improveto the Ground to be occupied by the proposed Docks, Piers, and ment Com-Works.

43. The Powers of this Act for the compulsory Purchase of Powers for Lands for the Purposes thereof shall not be exercised after the compulsory Purchases Expiration of Three Years from the passing thereof.

44. The Embankment, Docks, Piers, and other Works delineated Period for on the said Plans shall be completed within Six Years after the Completion passing of this Act, and on the Expiration of such Period the Powers by this Act and the Acts incorporated herewith given to the Company for constructing the Embankment, Docks, Piers, and other Works shall cease to be exercised, except as to so much of the same as shall be then completed.

45. The Company may from Time to Time widen, deepen, and Docks, &c., otherwise improve all or any of their Docks, Basins, Piers, and other may be Works, and may make additional Entrances, and may widen or otherwise improve the Quays thereof to such Extent and in such Manner as they may deem expedient.

46. The Company may from Time to Time apply such Sums of Power to Money as they shall think fit, not exceeding the Sum of One hundred Company to Pounds in any One Year, in or towards the several Objects and Pur- to Persons poses following; (that is to say,) Rewards to Persons who may assist in saving Life, the Preservation of the Lives of the Crew of Vessels wrecked at Fleetwood or on the Coasts adjacent thereto, or in the Preservation of such Vessels or the Cargoes thereof, or in the preserving or endeavouring to preserve the Life of any Person drowned or in danger of being drowned within any of the Docks or in the River Wyre.

47. The Company may demand and receive for every Vessel Rates on entering the Docks any Sum not exceeding the Rates specified in Sched. (A.) Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed.

A Portion of the Rates may be remitted in certain Cases. 48. Provided always, That the Company may exempt from a Portion of the said Rate any Vessel not exceeding Two hundred Tons, and may remit the said Rate in any Year for every Vessel propelled by Steam after it has so entered Fifteen Times in the Year, and for every Vessel not propelled by Steam after it has so entered Seven Times in the Year; provided also, that such Exemption shall be made equally to all Persons in respect of all Vessels of the same Description, or which shall have entered the same Number of Times within the Limits of this Act.

Additional Rates for Vessels remaining more than Six Weeks. 49. If any Vessel remain in the Wet Docks, or lie alongside or use any Wharf, Pier, Breakwater, or Landing Place belonging to the Company for any longer Space of Time than Six Weeks, the Company may demand and receive for every such Vessel a further Rate not exceeding Twopence per Week for every Ton Measurement thereof so long as such Vessel shall remain in the Harbour, or be alongside as aforesaid, beyond the said Period of Six Weeks.

Rates on Goods as in Sched. (B.) 50. The Company may demand and receive for all Animals, Merchandise, and Goods which shall be shipped or unshipped, received or delivered within the Docks, or upon or from any Wharf, Quay, Breakwater, Staith, Spout, Drop, or Pier belonging to the Company, any Sums not exceeding the Rates specified in Schedule (B.) to this Act annexed.

Rates for Passengers and Luggage as in Sched. (C.)

51. The Company may demand and take the several Tolls or Dues mentioned in the Schedule (C.) to this Act annexed before any Person shall be allowed to embark from any of the Works of the Company as a Passenger in any Steam or other Vessel or Boat, or, being a Passenger in any Steam or other Vessel or Boat, be landed on any Part of such Works, and before any Trunk, Portmanteau, Box, Parcel, or other Package falling under the Denomination of Luggage, shall be shipped on board any such Steam or other Vessel or Boat, or landed therefrom at any Part of such Works.

Rates for using Graving Docks.

52. The Company may demand and receive from the Master or Owner of every Vessel going into or using any Graving Dock according to the Tonnage Burden of such Vessel and the Number of Tides the same shall remain there such Rates or Charges as the Company shall from Time to Time think fit.

How Tides are to be reckoned when Vessels use Graving Docks.

53. The Tide in which any Vessel shall go into or make use of any Graving Dock shall be counted One Tide, and the Tide in which such Vessel shall leave or cease to make use of such Graving Dock shall also be counted One Tide.

54. The Master or Owner of any Vessel, and any Person apply- Master of ing to have any Vessel admitted into any Graving Dock, may be Vessel may be questioned questioned by any of the Harbour-masters as to the Dimensions and asto Draught Draught of Water of such Vessel, and also on any other Subject which of Water of may enable him to select the particular Graving Dock into which such Vessel may be admitted, and the Time of her Admittance thereto, and also to estimate the Amount of the Graving Dock Rates which may probably become payable in respect of such Vessel; and if such Master, Owner, or other Person shall refuse to answer any reasonable Question, or shall wilfully give a false Answer, or if such Master or Owner shall do or permit any Act to be done by which the Draught of such Vessel shall be increased while in a Graving Dock, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence be liable to a Penalty of not exceeding Ten Pounds; and if by reason of any such Refusal, or any such false Answer, or any such other Offence or Act as aforesaid, such Vessel, or any other Vessel, shall be prevented from or hindered in going into any Graving Dock, whereby any Damage shall be sustained by the Company, either from Loss of Rates or from any other Cause, such Master or Owner shall make good the same to the Company; and any Deposit which may have been made under the Authority of any Byelaw on account of such Rates shall be absolutely forfeited.

55. In case the Master or Owner of any Vessel going into or Removing of making use of any Graving Dock shall neglect to remove such Vessel Vessels from from such Graving Dock when the Period for which she entered the Gravin Docks. same shall have expired, or at the Time required by any Byelaw relating thereto, the Company may, if they shall deem it expedient so to do, but not otherwise, cause such Vessel to be removed into any other Dock although the same be not a Graving Dock; and all Costs consequent upon such Removal, together with the Costs of procuring and putting Ballast on board such Vessel, and of making her sufficiently Water-tight for Removal, if deemed expedient so to do. shall be a Charge upon such Vessel, and may be recovered from the Master or Owner thereof in the same Manner in all respects as any Tonnage Rates are by this Act authorized to be recovered: Provided always, that the Power hereby given to the Company to cause any such Vessel as aforesaid to be removed from a Graving Dock shall not be construed to exonerate the Master or Owner of such Vessel from the Payment of any Graving Dock Rates or from any other Payments to which he might otherwise be liable.

56. In addition to the Remedies given by "The Harbours, Docks, As to and Piers Clauses Act, 1847," for the Recovery of the several Rates Recovery hereby granted to the Company, the Company may recover such Rates in the following Manner; (that is to say,) any Rates which [Local.] 28 R

the Company may demand in respect of a Vessel may be recovered from the Owner or Master of such Vessel, and any Rates which the Company may demand in respect of Goods may be recovered from the Owner or Consignee of such Goods; and in every such Case such Rates may be sued for and recovered by the Company in any Court of competent Jurisdiction.

Rates to be charged for Use of Cranes, Weighing Machines, &c.

57. The Company may demand and receive, for the Use of their Warehouses, Cranes, Weighing and Measuring Machines, Works, and Conveniences, of and from the Owner or Person having the Charge of any Goods, Articles, or Things deposited in such Warehouses, or loaded or unloaded, weighed or measured by means of such Cranes, Weighing and Measuring Machines, Works and Conveniences, such reasonable Rates as the Company shall from Time to Time appoint.

Limits within which Dock-master may exercise his Authority. 58. The Limits within which the Powers of the Superintendent and Dock-master for the Regulation of the Docks shall be exercised shall be the Dock, Entrance, Piers, Works, and Property of the Company: Provided always, that the Powers of the Harbour-master for the Time being appointed for the Purposes of the Act Fifth William the Fourth, Cap. 58, within the aforesaid Limits, shall not be prejudiced, lessened, or interfered with under this Act.

Officers of Customs to have free Access to Docks without Payment of Toll. 59. All Officers of Customs being in the Execution of their Duty shall have free Ingress and Egress into and out of the said Docks and Premises and through the Gates and Entrances of the same, and may freely pass and repass with their Vessels and Boats through the Locks and Water Communications of the said Docks at all Times (provided the State of the Tide and Water Communications of the said Docks and Premises will admit of such passing) without Payment of any Toll or Sum for so doing.

Power to Company to provide Engines, &c. 60. The Company may provide such Steam Engines, Vessels, Piling Engines, Diving Bells, Ballast Lighters, and Rubbish Lighters, and other Machinery and Vessels as they think necessary for any of the other Purposes of this Act, and may demand and receive such Sums for the Use of the same as they think reasonable.

Power to run Docks dry for the Purpose of Repairs, &c. 61. The Company may run any of the Docks dry or lower the Level of the Water therein for the Purpose of repairing or cleansing the same or for any other Purpose, and if they shall think proper they may remove out of any of such Docks any Vessel then lying therein whether she shall or shall not have discharged the whole of her Cargo, or may give reasonable Notice to the Master of such Vessel to remove the same out of the Dock so to be run dry or partially discharged of Water, by delivering the same to the Person

in charge of the Vessel, or if he cannot be found by affixing such Notice to the Mast or some other conspicuous Part of the said Vessel, and whether there shall then be any Person in charge or on board thereof or not; and in case the said Vessel shall not be removed after such Notice, the Company shall not be responsible for any Damage which such Vessel or her Cargo may sustain in consequence of the Dock being run dry or partially discharged of Water; and if after any such Notice such Vessel shall not be removed, and the Company shall have caused such Vessel to be removed, then the Master thereof shall repay to the Company the Costs attending such Removal.

62. The Company may, upon the Request of any Person ware-Certificate of housing or depositing Goods in any Warehouse of the Company, or Goods being entitled to any Goods so warehoused, issue and deliver to him a warrant for Certificate of such Goods having been so deposited or warehoused, or Delivery to a Warrant for the Delivery of such Goods or of any Part thereof be in Form approved by to be specified in such Warrant; and every such Certificate shall Company. be in a Form to be approved by the Company; and every such Certificate or Warrant shall be transferable by special Endorsement, and shall entitle the Person named therein or the Endorsee who may be the Holder thereof, to the Delivery of any such Goods on Performance of the Conditions contained in such Certificate or Warrant.

63. Every Vessel lying within any Dock shall always have as Vessels to be much Ballast or Cargo on board as may be necessary to enable her to always kept be removed with Safety, either from Place to Place within such Dock with Ballast or from one Dock into another Dock, or out of the Docks, whenever or otherwise it may be necessary in the Judgment of the Dock-master to remove safely such Vessel; and in case of any Neglect to keep such Quantity of removed. Ballast or Cargo on board any Vessel the Master or Owner thereof shall be liable to a Penalty of not exceeding Fifty Pounds.

64. The Company shall not be compelled nor compellable to Company not receive within their Docks or upon their Works any Articles which in their Opinion shall endanger the Safety of the Docks or the Mer-dangerous chandise contained therein: Provided that the Company shall from Articles. Time to Time publish and declare, at all Times and Places where and in the same Manner as they are by Law bound to publish and declare, a List of their Tolls and Charges, a Schedule of the Articles or Class of Goods which they refuse to receive within their Docks or upon their Works; and any Person who shall from and after such Notice cause or permit to be brought within the Docks, or within the Limits specified by Clause 58. of this Act, any such prohibited Articles.

compelled to receive

Articles, shall for every Offence forfeit a Sum not exceeding One hundred Pounds.

Penalty for bringing Gunpowder into Docks, &c. 65. No Person shall bring any Gunpowder or Combustibles into the Docks, or into any Vessel lying in any Dock, nor shall any Vessel having Gunpowder on board thereof be brought or lie within the Buoys moored off the Docks, or, in case of the Removal of such Buoys, within Three hundred Yards of any Dock or Pier, unless driven by Stress of Weather; and any Person who shall cause or permit Gunpowder to be brought into the Docks or into any Vessel lying in any Dock, and the Master of any Vessel having Gunpowder on board who shall suffer such Vessel to be brought or remain or lie within the Distance aforesaid, shall for every such Offence be liable to a Penalty of not exceeding One hundred Pounds, and the Harbour-master shall have Power to destroy any Gunpowder brought into or being in any Dock or Vessel contrary to the Provisions of this Act.

Vessels in Her Majesty's Service exempted. 66. No such Provisions as aforesaid relating to Gunpowder shall extend to any of Her Majesty's Ships of War or other Vessels belonging to or in the Service of Her Majesty; and if any Person shall claim and take the Benefit or attempt to take the Benefit of any such Exemption as aforesaid without being entitled thereto, he shall for every such Offence be liable to a Penalty of Ten Pounds.

Company not to be liable for Losses by Fire, &c. 67. The Company shall not, under any Circumstances or in any Case whatever, other than by reason of the Carelessness or Negligence of their Officers, Servants, or Workmen, be answerable or accountable for or be liable to make good any Loss or Damage which may happen to any Goods, or to any Vessel, or to any Property of any Description by Fire, Storm, or Tempest, or from any Civil Commotion, or by the Act of the Queen's Enemies, or other inevitable Accident.

Power to punish for cutting or defacing Ropes, &c. 68. If any Person shall wilfully cut, break, loose, or damage any Rope or Chain by which any Vessel shall be moored or fastened in any Dock, or shall do any wilful Damage to the same or any Part thereof, every such Person so offending shall on Conviction, in addition to paying for all the Damage thereby occasioned, forfeit and pay a Sum not exceeding Ten Pounds for every such Offence, or, in the Discretion of the Justice before whom the Complaint shall be heard, shall suffer Imprisonment for the same, if under any Warrant of Commitment of any Justice of the County of Lancaster in the Common Goal or House of Correction of the same County, and be there kept to Hard Labour for any Term not exceeding Three Months.

69. The Company on the one Part, and the Two Companies or Traffic Areither of them on the other Part, may from Time to Time enter into and carry into effect Contracts or Agreements with respect to the following Purposes, or any of them, and any incidental Matters; (that is to say,)

The Collection, Regulation, Management, Interchange, Transmission, and Delivery of Traffic passing to or from the respective Undertakings of the Company and the Two Companies, or either of them:

The fixing and Collection, Division and Apportionment, of the Tolls, Rates, and Charges to be levied or taken in respect of such Traffic, or any Part thereof, respectively, and otherwise in relation thereto, the Payments and Allowances, periodical or otherwise, to be paid or allowed by either of the contracting Companies to the other of them, and the Appropriation

The Appropriation for the joint or separate Use of the Company and the Two Companies or either of them, of any Warehouses, Quays, Wharves, or other Conveniences of the Company or the Two Companies or either of them.

70. 72. And whereas Part of the Lands which may be required for Authorizing the Purposes of this Act belong to the Queen's most Excellent Sale of Lands Majesty in right of Her Duchy of Lancaster: Be it enacted, that it the Duchy of shall be lawful for the Chancellor and Council of Her Majesty's Lancaster, Duchy of Lancaster for the Time being to agree with the Company ing for Apfor the absolute Sale in Fee Simple of the Lands, or any Part thereof, plication of Purchase of or belonging to Her said Majesty in right of Her said Duchy which shall be required for the Purposes of this Act, at or for such Price or Compensation in Money, and upon such Terms and Conditions as shall be settled and agreed upon between the said Chan-

75. Nothing in this Act contained shall extend to prejudice, Saving diminish, or derogate from the Estates, Rights, Interests, Privileges, Rights of Lords of Powers, or Authorities of any Bodies Politic or Corporate, Lords of Manors, &c. Manors, or other Person or Persons themselves, his, her, or their Heirs, Successors, Executors, and Administrators, other than and except those expressly named by this Act.

76. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to exempt the Nothing to Undertaking by this Act authorized from the Provisions of "The exempt Works from Merchant Shipping Law Amendment Act, 1853," "The Merchant Provisions of Shipping Act, 1854," or any General Act relating to Harbours or General Dues on Shipping, or on Goods carried in Ships, or to Pilotage, or to Lights, Buoys, and Beacons, and the Rights and Privileges of the General Lighthouse Authorities now in force or which shall be passed during the present or any future Session of Parliament, or from any future Revision and Alteration, under the Authority of Parliament, of the Dues or Tolls authorized by this Act.

Expenses of Act.

77. The Costs, Charges, and Expenses of and incidental to the passing of this Act, and preparatory thereto, shall be paid by the Company.
