Annex 2 Extract from the Executive Committee meeting [28/10/2024]

3.1 Spending review.

 The AG decided that the SFO accommodation move was not justifiable when compared to other demands across the Law Officer Departments, and accordingly the proposed move will not happen as planned. The SFO will consider how we can spend some of this year's allocated money - £3.97m - on improving Cockspur Street, initially for those working in the subbasement.
