II.1 Animal Health Attestation

I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian, hereby certify that the 'other mammals' of the consignment described in Part I meet the following requirements:

II.1.1 Country/Territory of origin

i) The country or territory described in boxes I.7. and I.8 is a WOAH member country.

II.1.2 Premises of origin as described in box I.11

- i) [is [approved][registered]¹ by a competent authority in the third country of origin]^{1,5};
- ii) is not subject to national restrictions for animal health reasons;
- iii) where there have been no clinical cases of rabies in the 6 months prior to the date of dispatch;
- iv) where there have been no reports of Brucella spp. and Tuberculosis complex in the 12 months prior to the date of dispatch;
- v) [in which the animals have remained since birth or were resident for at least 6 months prior to issue of this certificate]¹

or

[in which the animals have remained since birth or were resident for at least 3 months prior to issue of this certificate]^{1,2}

- or[the country or territory described in boxes I.7. and I.8 is listed in Annex II of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No 577/2013]^{1,3}
- vi) [is under veterinary supervision and is subject to animal health surveillance and biosecurity measures according to the "Animal Health Regulation" (Reg (EU) 2016/429)]^{1,5}
- vii) where animals added to the establishment, and susceptible to diseases relevant to the animals to be exported, are quarantined and will remain in their quarantine for at least 30 days, if imported or if they come from establishments of a lower health status.

II.1.3 Animals

- i. [are individually identified by means of an implanted transponder]^{1,4};
- ii. have not been in contact with animals suspected of having rabies in the previous 6 months;
- have been kept isolated from other animals not complying with at least the same health requirements as described in this certificate for the last 30 days and, if applicable, during their transportation from the premises of origin to the place of loading;
- iv. have been examined within the period of 24 hours prior to the time of loading for dispatch to Ireland, and found to be free of clinical signs of infectious diseases including those referred to in Annex 1 of Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/692 and are fit for the intended transport;
- v. there is no reason to suspect it/they have been exposed to an infectious disease prior to issue of this certificate;
- vi. are not animals to be killed under a national programme for the eradication of disease;
- vii. [in the case of bats (Chiroptera) the prevention and control rules, mentioned in Article 9(1) of Regulation (EU) 2016/429 on the basis of Article 2 and the annex of Implementing regulation (EU) 2018/1882, are met]¹
- viii. [in the case of Lagomorphs, the animals come from an establishment in which no clinical signs of myxomatosis, VHD (viral or rabbit haemorrhagic disease) or tularemia have been observed during the 6 months prior to the date of dispatch to Ireland]¹
- ix. [In the case of fruit bats of the genus Pteropus from Malaysia (Peninsula) or Australia the animals comply with the following conditions regarding Decision 2006/146/EC:
 - a) the animals originate from captive colonies,
 - b) the animals have been isolated in quarantine premises for at least 60 days and
 - c) the animals have been subjected with negative results to a serum neutralisation or approved ELISA test for antibody against Hendra and Nipah disease viruses, carried out in a laboratory approved for these tests by the competent authorities on samples of blood taken on two occasions with an interval of 21 to 30 days, the second sample to be taken within 10 days of export]¹

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- x. [They do not concern the following species from zones or countries whose import is prohibited under Decision 2003/459/EC with regard to monkey pox virus;
 - a) prairie dogs (Cynomys sp.) originating in or coming from the United States of America
 - b) rodents of non-domestic species and all squirrels originating in or coming from third countries of the African sub-Saharan region]¹
- xi. [their movement has been approved in advance by agreement of the Irish Competent Authority (*Licence No.*:)]^{1,5}

II.1.5 Animal transport attestation

I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian, hereby certify that:

- i. [Arrangements were made to transport the animals in compliance with Council Regulation (EC) No. 1/2005, IATA guidelines and/or CITES guidelines for transport, where applicable or of other recognised international standards for transport of animals, in particular as regards watering, feeding and the use of the transport container where applicable and it/they is/are fit for the intended transport;

- v. Arrangements have been made to load the animal(s) for dispatch to Ireland into the transport box/container above, which has been so constructed that faeces, urine, litter, or fodder could not flow or fall out of the vehicle or container during transportation;

- i. [At the time of inspection the animal(s) was/were fit to travel on the intended journey in accordance with the provisions of Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 and with IATA requirements and/or CITES guidelines for transport where applicable.]^{1,3}
- II.1.6 They are not an invasive exotic species according to Regulation (EU) no. 1143/2014^A or Statutory Instrument 374 of 2024^B.
