



CHAPTER viii.

An Act to revive the powers and extend the period for A.D. 1882. the compulsory purchase of lands and to extend the period for the completion of the Works authorised by the Bristol Port and Channel Dock Act 1877 and for other [19th May 1882.] purposes.

HEREAS by the Bristol Port and Channel Dock Act 1877 40 & 41 Vict. (in this Act referred to as "the Act of 1877") the Bristol Port and Channel Dock Company (in this Act called "the Company") were authorised to make and maintain the graving dock piers and works mentioned in that Act:

And whereas by the Act of 1877 the periods for the compulsory purchase of lands for and for the completion of such works were limited to three and five years respectively from the passing of that Act which received the Royal Assent on the twenty-eighth day of June 1877:

And whereas it is expedient that the said powers for the com-· pulsory purchase of lands should be revived and the time for the completion of the said works should be extended as herein-after provided:

And whereas the objects of this Act cannot be effected without the authority of Parliament:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows; (that is to say),

- 1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the Bristol Port Short title. and Channel Dock Company (Extension of Time) Act 1882.
- 2. The Act of 1877 as amended by this Act and this Act shall Act of 1877 and this Act be read together as and shall form one Act. to form one [Local.-8.]Act.

3. Part II. (relating to extension of time) of the Railways Clauses Act 1863 so far as not expressly varied by this Act is incorporated with this Act and as so incorporated shall be read and apply as if the said works authorised by the Act of 1877 were a railway.

Powers of Act of 1877 for purchase of lands revived and extended. 4. All the rights powers and authorities conferred upon the Company by the Act of 1877 for the compulsory purchase of lands shall be and the same are hereby revived and may be exercised within but shall not be exercised after two years from the twenty-eighth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Extending period for completion of works.

5. The time limited by the Act of 1877 for the completion of the graving dock piers and works by that Act authorised shall be extended and enlarged until the expiration of three years from the twenty-eighth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two and if the said graving dock piers and works shall not be completed within the period so limited by this Act then on the expiration of such period the powers by the Act of 1877 conferred upon the Company for making and maintaining the same or otherwise in relation thereto shall cease to be exercised except as to so much thereof as shall then be completed.

Costs of Act.

6. All costs charges and expenses of and incident to the preparing for obtaining and passing of this Act shall be paid by the Company.
