## **Sponsored academy orders**

Points discussed in relation to school sponsorship

Project: A proposal for The Leaf Trust to sponsor Willow Park CofE Primary School (URN 148841), Bristol, City of

#### Representations received:

No representations were made for this project.

#### Points raised in Discussion:

- Willow Park CofE Primary School is a local authority maintained school in central Bristol and received an Inadequate Ofsted Judgement in March 2024.
- It is a School of Sanctuary, 65% of the pupils are refugees. Many of these students
  and their families have experienced trauma and need significant support to adjust to
  school and life in the UK. The school has a high pupil turnover, with over 300
  children enrolling and leaving in the past 24 months, due to its location near
  accommodation for refugees and asylum seekers.
- The Leaf Trust has been providing support to Willow Park since June 2024, commissioned by Bristol City Council.
- Willow Park received an Ofsted monitoring visit in January 2025 and the monitoring report highlighted the impact of the support provided by Leaf.
- The school would be best supported by joining a trust.
- The Leaf Trust was established in September 2023 and as a new trust does not have a proven track record of performance. However, Regions Group recognised the experienced leadership in the trust.
- It was approved at the February Advisory Board for three schools to join the trust.
- The growth strategy of the trust was discussed with a period of consolidation recommended. Regions Group will continue to discuss growth plans with the trust and will continue to make future growth decisions based on the High-Quality Trust Framework.

## **Trust Changes**

Points discussed in relation to academies moving to another trust.

Project: A proposal for Tredworth Infant and Nursery Academy (URN 140789), Gloucestershire to transfer from Tredworth Infant and Nursery Academy (SAT) to SAND Academies Trust

#### Representations received:

• No representations were made for this project.

#### Points raised in Discussion:

- Tredworth Infant and Nursery Academy is a 2-form entry Infant School and received a Good Ofsted judgement in March 2023.
- Given the pupil cohort Trustees want to work with trusts experienced in SEND. They
  agreed that SAND could support the SEND needs at Tredworth Infant. SAND has
  already provided SEND audits and extra training, support, and guidance for the team
  at Tredworth, where the number of pupils with SEND has increased over the past
  two years.
- The school is geographically close to Calton Primary School, which joined the trust in September 2024, and Willow Primary Academy. The headteachers at Calton and Willow are working with the head at Tredworth to find ways to benefit their shared communities.
- AB members discussed the School Improvement (SI) model, accountability, and its
  practical application for primary schools. Regions Group provided assurances that
  they will discuss the SI model with the trust and offer recommendations to help them
  develop this further. It was recommended for the trust to undertake an external
  review of mainstream school improvement systems within 18 months.

Project: A proposal for Kingsmead Academy (URN 136639), Somerset to transfer from Kingsmead Academy (SAT) to Cabot Learning Federation.

## Project: A proposal for the following six academies to transfer from Leading Edge Academies Partnership to Truro & Penwith Academy Trust:

- St Buryan Primary School (URN 136269), Cornwall
- Mounts Bay Academy (URN 136873), Cornwall
- St Hilary School (URN 136879), Cornwall
- Ludgvan School (URN 137466), Cornwall
- Fowey River Academy (URN 140836), Cornwall
- The Five Islands Academy (URN 144638), Isles of Scilly

#### Representations received:

No representations were made for this project.

#### Points raised in Discussion:

- This is a voluntary application from Leading Edge Academies Partnership (LEAP) to transfer into Truro and Penwith Academy Trust (TPAT).
- LEAP is a cross-phase multi academy trust made up of three primary schools, two secondary schools and one all through school with a footprint in the east and west of Cornwall and Isles of Scilly.
- The Five Islands Academy, an all-through school on the Isles of Scilly, faces unique challenges related to boarding provision, SEND, and off-island satellite classrooms on the smaller islands around St Mary's.
- LEAP wants to join Truro and Penwith Academy Trust (TPAT) because they believe TPAT aligns with their values, vision, and ethos. TPAT can provide the necessary capacity for sustained school improvement. Additionally, TPAT's similar geography would help LEAP schools feel less isolated and integrate into TPAT's existing hubs for support.
- TPAT has a proven record of improving outcomes over a period of time and sustaining these improvements. They have extensive experience with rural schools in disadvantaged communities.
- Ofsted outcomes and reports have recognised the trust's positive impact on school improvement. The trust plans to expand its school improvement team starting in September 2025.
- TPAT plans to change its governance structure to adopt church articles and include the Diocese of Truro Education Board at both the member and trustee levels. These discussions are to be resolved ahead of the transfer.
- The growth strategy of the trust was discussed with a period of consolidation recommended until Regions Group have sight of the 2025/26 outcomes.
- It is recommended that the trust undergo an external review of school improvement (SI) within six months of the LEAP schools joining, focusing on the current SI model and the integration of LEAP schools.
