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
What is the Open Innovation Team?

The Open Innovation Team (OIT) is a government unit that works with experts to generate analysis and ideas for policy.

We operate like an in-house consultancy, delivering projects for colleagues across government and charging them to recover our costs.

We have five university partners – Brunel, Essex, Lancaster, Surrey and York – but we work with academics and industry experts worldwide.

We also innovate to create other cost-recovery services for government, including an evaluation unit that we set up last year.

We engage experts on your behalf, organising interviews, workshops and other events as needed


Research synthesis

AI in education

We've worked with DfE colleagues on Al in schools for more than 18 months. In a stream of related projects, we've engaged experts, organised events, reviewed evidence, provided advice, and created guidance for schools and edtech developers.



Department for Energy Security & Net Zero

Energy efficiency

Working with DESNZ for over a year, we've delivered a series of projects on how government can improve non-domestic energy efficiency. Our work has allowed the commissioning team to shift away from external consultants, saving them money without sacrificing quality.



Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office

Intercultural relationships

In a three-month project, our team worked with academics, practitioners and officials to develop advice for colleagues tasked with building relationships and influencing overseas. The framework we created has since been integrated into official FCDO training.

Our wider offer

In addition to our core offer, we organise events, offer training and experiment with other services that we think might be of use to colleagues.



We connect academics and officials

We experiment with new ways of increasing collaboration between academics and officials, including working with our partner universities to provide academic mentorships for colleagues interested in conducting policy-related research.



We organise events with leading experts

We organise events that help officials engage with world-leading thinkers and learn about their ideas. Our talks are attended by hundreds and have included presentations from more than a dozen Nobel Prize winners, including Daron Acemoglu, Claudia Goldin and Venki Ramakrishnan.



We develop and test new ideas and services

For example, we're currently incubating a new cross-government evaluation service, we're scoping an Al adoption service, and we're speaking to colleagues in DESNZ about helping them set up a new systems thinking service.

FAQs

How can we commission you?

We're part of government so there's no need for a complicated commissioning process. It can be as simple as a short email from the budget holder.

Are you cheaper than external consultancies?

We're civil servants so we're usually cheaper than external consultants, and we're easier to commission so you save on procurement costs too.

What sorts of policy projects do you work on?

We work with all government departments and agencies, across all policy areas, on projects as diverse as generative AI in schools, net zero, foreign policy and prison reform.

Which universities do you work with?

We work with all universities across the UK and internationally.

We also have five university partners – Brunel University, University of Essex, Lancaster University, University of Surrey and University of York – seeking their input on policy projects where appropriate and delivering training and advice to their academics and students.
