


## Medicines & Healthcare products Regulatory Agency



The assessment team will notify the applicant if some or all of the optional steps are likely to be undertaken.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup>For some major reclassifications, an RFI may not be issued, and the assessment will proceed to step 5.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> A major reclassification application will be downgraded to a standard application if no advice is sought from the Commission on Human Medicines (CHM).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup>120 days based on **two** RFI letters being issued. 90 days with one RFI letter issued.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup>160 days based on the optional steps **not** being undertaken. 225 days with all of the optional steps included. These timelines are based on **two RFI letters issued at step 3**. If only one RFI letter is issued at step 3, the regulatory clock will be 30 days shorter. <sup>5</sup>Appeal procedure will proceed in accordance with timelines advised by the CHM secretariat.
