Sponsored academy orders

Points discussed in relation to school sponsorship

Project: A proposal for The Blackdown Education Partnership to sponsor Tiverton High School (URN 113548), Devon

Representations received:

• No representations were made for this project.

Points raised in discussion:

- Tiverton High School (THS) is a 11-16 1,400 place secondary school, situated in Mid Devon and received an Inadequate Ofsted Judgement in October 2024 – previously Good in January 2019.
- Blackdown Education Partnership (BEP) have been supporting Tiverton from November 2024 through a management partnership and have added significant resource into the school.
- THS will benefit from the continuity of support from BEP and from the collaboration provided in a multi academy structure.
- BEP is a good trust, with a proven record of good outcomes, and of sustaining and improving Ofsted judgements across their schools.
- The School Improvement model of the trust was discussed; the Trust has a well-defined school improvement model and continues to invest in its development.
 Regions Group provided assurances, and this will be discussed at the trust review meetings.
- AB members questioned the building issues at THS that require investment. The
 responsibility to maintain Tiverton's existing buildings will be with BEP and the
 schools rebuilding programme are working closely with BEP. The Trust are also
 working with Devon local authority prior to transfer. Regions Group will continue to
 work closely with the Trust as plans progress.
- The growth strategy of the trust was discussed. Regions Group will discuss growth plans with the trust and make future growth decisions based on the High-Quality Trust Framework.

Points raised in discussion:

- Delta and Castleman have been working collaboratively for several years and are now voluntarily seeking to merge to form a new, Primary, SEN and AP phase trust of a larger and more sustainable size, containing 11 schools and circa. 3,511 pupils.
- The School Improvement model of the trust was discussed and AB members requested further information on how this would work in practice.
- Strong rationale for merger recognised but AB members also asked for more information about the vision, values, and ethos of the new trust.
- The structure of the trust board and experience was discussed and further information on the expertise of the new board was requested.

RD decision: Defer - to be brought back to Regional Director at later date once more information is provided about issues discussed.

Points discussed in relation to significant changes to an open academy

Project: An application for E-ACT the Dolphin School (URN 138377) and E-ACT Fairlawn Primary School (URN 140269), Bristol, City of (E-ACT) to make the following change:

 To merge E-ACT The Dolphin School with E-ACT Fairlawn Primary School and form one entity on the site of E-ACT Fairlawn Primary School

Representations received:

No representations were made for this project.

Points raised in discussion:

- E-ACT is seeking approval to merge two nearby schools, The Dolphin School and Fairlawn Primary School, and to increase the published admission arrangements (PAN) at Fairlawn from 30 to 60 to accommodate the merger.
- The Dolphin School is a 4-11 primary academy located in Montpelier, Bristol and received a Requires Improvement Ofsted Judgement in March 2024.
- Fairlawn Primary School is a 4-11 primary school academy in Montpelier, Bristol. It is graded Ofsted Good, currently Fairlawn is at 59.5% capacity.
- E- ACT have said that the merger will ensure that all pupils benefit from high-quality teaching, well-resourced facilities and a stable and inspiring learning environment.
- The proposed change aims to enhance the leadership and governance by consolidating leadership structures within a single academy. Fairlawn's leadership team will oversee the merged school, providing continuity and stability.
- AB members asked about The Dolphin School site. The trust is considering repurposing the Dolphin site as the Sixth Form for E-ACT Montpelier High School, and this is currently being discussed with the Local Authority.
