Proposal Erection of 75no. dwellings with associated infrastructure and landscaping. Provision of playing fields and associated clubhouse.

Referring to the consultation on a planning application dated 29 May 2025 referenced above, in the vicinity of the M11/A120 that forms part of the Strategic Road Network, notice is hereby given that National Highways' formal recommendation is as follows:

- a. **No Objection:** see reasons at Annex A.
- b. **Conditional Approval:** National Highways recommends approval of the application, subject to the agreement and implementation of planning conditions and/or obligations as set out in Annex A.
- c. **Deferral:** National Highways is not currently in a position to support this application and requests further assessment, evidence, revisions and/or dialogue as set out in Annex A.
- d. **Refusal:** recommend that the application be refused for the reasons set out in Annex A.

Highways Act 1980 Section 175B is not relevant to this application.¹

Annex A National Highways' assessment of the proposed development

National Highways has been appointed by the Secretary of State for Transport as a strategic highway company under the provisions of the Infrastructure Act 2015 and is the highway authority, traffic authority and street authority for the Strategic Road Network (SRN). The SRN is a critical national asset and as such we work to ensure that it operates and is managed in the public interest, both in respect of current activities and needs as well as in providing effective stewardship of its long-term operation and integrity.

Reason

The site is for 75 new dwellings in the existing settlement of Saffron Walden, this is some way from the SRN which can be accessed by various routes. Given the size and the location of this development it is unlikely to have any impact upon the SRN.

Standing advice to the local planning authority

The Climate Change Committee's <u>2022 Report to Parliament</u> notes that for the UK to achieve net zero carbon status by 2050, action is needed to support a modal shift away from car travel. The NPPF supports this position, with paragraphs 74 and 109 prescribing that significant development should offer a genuine choice of transport modes, while paragraphs 108 and 114 advise that appropriate opportunities to promote walking, cycling and public transport should be taken up.

Moreover, the build clever and build efficiently criteria as set out in clause 6.1.4 of PAS2080 promote the use of low carbon materials and products, innovative design solutions and construction methods to minimise resource consumption.

These considerations should be weighed alongside any relevant Local Plan policies to ensure that planning decisions are in line with the necessary transition to net zero carbon.
