Summary

This is a summary of UK legislation in food and feed law and related scientific and regulatory issues for the period from 1 October to 31 December 2024. Other relevant technical updates are listed thereafter.

The Nutrition and Health Claims (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2024 provide for the enforcement and execution of EC Regulation 1924/2006 in Wales. Also available in Welsh.

The Feed Additives (Authorisations) and Uses of Feed Intended for Particular Nutritional Purposes (Amendment of Commission Regulation (EU) 2020/354) (England) Regulations 2024 make an amendment to the feed for particular uses Regulations, and authorise / re-authorise a number of feed additives in England. Similar Regulations apply in Scotland The Feed Additives (Authorisations) and Uses of Feed Intended for Particular Nutritional Purposes (Miscellaneous Amendment) (Scotland) Regulations 2024 and in Wales The Feed Additives (Authorisations) and Uses of Feed Intended for Particular Nutritional Purposes (Amendment of Commission Regulation (EU) 2020/354) (Wales) Regulations 2024 and in Welsh.

The Official Controls (Import of High Risk Food and Feed of Non-Animal Origin) Amendment (Scotland) (No. 2) Regulations 2024 make amendments to the list of foods and analytes which are subject to temporary increase in official controls at point of entry to the UK. Equivalent Regulations apply to England The Official Controls (Import of High-Risk Food and Feed of Non-Animal Origin) (Amendment of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1793) (England) (No. 2) Regulations 2024 and Wales The Official Controls (Import of

<u>High-Risk Food and Feed of Non-Animal Origin)</u> (Amendment of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1793) (No. 2) (Wales) Regulations 2024 and in Welsh

The Food Safety (Sampling and Qualifications) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2024 makes amendments to the list of specified states with regard to the recognition of professional qualifications.

The Bread and Flour (Amendment) (England) Regulations 2024 adds the definitions 'common wheat' and 'wholemeal flour' and makes amendments to the essential ingredients including the mandatory addition of folic acid. Equivalent Regulations apply to Northern Ireland <u>The Bread and Flour (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2024</u>, and Scotland <u>The Bread and Flour Amendment (Scotland) Regulations 2024</u>.

<u>The Free-Range Egg Marketing Standards (Amendment) (Scotland) Regulations 2024</u> makes amendment to the requirements for marketing eggs as 'free range'.
