- 1. The complaints in respect of unpaid holiday pay and deductions from pay are not well-founded and are dismissed.
- 2. The complaint of unfair dismissal succeeds the claimant was unfairly dismissed.
- 3. The respondent shall pay compensation to the claimant of £2,134.61, made up as follows:
 - a. A basic award for unfair dismissal of £1,929.00 (having been reduced by 60% under s.122(2) ERA); and
 - b. A compensatory award for unfair dismissal of £205.61 (being 1 week of net pay reduced by 60% under s.123(6) ERA, the award otherwise being nil by consequence of the cumulative reductions made under s.123(1) and (6) ERA).
