JUDGMENT

1.The claimants compliant of an unlawful deduction from wages (none payment of pay) is well founded and the tribunal declares accordingly.

The respondent shall pay the claimant within 14 days of the date this judgment is sent to it, the sum of £1748 gross. The employee shall assume sole responsibility for any tax or national insurance.

2. The claimants compliant of an unlawful deduction from wages (none payment of holiday pay) is well founded and the tribunal declares accordingly.

The respondent shall pay the claimant within 14 days of the date this judgment is sent to it, the sum of £537.07 gross. The employee shall assume sole responsibility for any tax or national insurance.
