Introduction

Situated along the southern coast of west Africa, Ivory Coast shares borders with Liberia, Guinea, Mali, Burkina Faso, Ghana and has a coastline on the Gulf of Guinea. During the 15th and 16th centuries, French and Portuguese merchant-explorers divided the west coast of Africa into four distinct “coasts” reflecting the prominent trade routes in the region. Consequently, this particular stretch of the west coast became known as “Ivory Coast”. A French protectorate since 1842, the country became part of French West Africa from 1904 until it achieved independence from France in 1960.

Geographical names policy

Geographical names in Ivory Coast are predominantly written in a French style, although they may originate from one of the many local languages spoken within the country. These names, written in Roman script, should be taken from official sources where possible, and all diacritical marks should be retained⁵. In the absence of official Ivory Coast mapping, maps produced by the French *Institute national de l'information géographique et forestière* (IGN) are a reliable source of geographical names.

¹ Ivory Coast is the usual country name in the English language and can be used for internal HMG and UK domestic purposes. Côte d'Ivoire should be used for all correspondence and relations with the country itself. Côte d'Ivoire should also be used in correspondence with international organizations, such as the United Nations.



Languages

French is the official language⁶ and *lingua franca* of Ivory Coast. Ethnologue⁷ lists 76 living languages for Ivory Coast including Baoulé (*bci*), Dioula (*dyu*), Dan (*dnj*), Anyin (*any*) and Senari (*sef*). These local languages are part of the Niger-Congo language family.

Administrative structure

In September 2011, a decentralization programme established 12 districts and 2 autonomous districts (centred around Abidjan and Yamoussoukro) as the 1st-order administrative divisions (ADM1) of Ivory Coast. In June 2021, the 12 districts also became autonomous districts (*fra: district autonome*). The 12 newly designated autonomous districts are subdivided into 31 regions (*fra: région*) at 2nd-order administrative level (ADM2), 95 departments (*fra: département*) at 3rd-order administrative level (ADM3) and 498 sub-prefectures (*fra: sous-préfecture*) at 4th-order administrative level (ADM4).
