Construction Noise and Vibration Monthly Report – April 2025

West Northamptonshire District Council

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Non-Technical Summary

This Noise and Vibration Monitoring Report fulfils HS2 Limited's commitment detailed in the Environmental Minimum Requirements (EMRs), Annex 1, Code of Construction Practice, to present the results of noise and vibration monitoring carried out within West Northamptonshire District Council (WNDC) area during the month of April 2025.

Within this period noise monitoring was undertaken in the vicinity of the following worksites:

- Fir Tree Nursery Worksite (ref.: FTN) where topsoil stripping, stockpile management, site access road maintenance, haul road operation, material movements, temporary pond works, water management, and vegetation and ditch maintenance were underway.
- Lower Boddington Worksite (ref.: LB) where topsoil stripping, stockpile management, site access road maintenance, haul road operation, material movements, temporary pond works, water management, viaduct construction, bulk excavation, and vegetation and ditch maintenance were underway.
- Chipping Warden Worksite (ref.: CW) where Green tunnel erection and maintenance, bulk earthworks, site access road maintenance, haul road operation, material movements, batching plant operation, general maintenance, stockpile management, water management and material processing were underway.
- Blackgrounds worksite (ref.: BG) where topsoil stripping, stockpile management, site access road maintenance, haul road operation, material movements, water management and vegetation and ditch maintenance were underway.
- Lower Thorpe worksite (ref.: LT) where topsoil stripping, stockpile management, site access road maintenance, haul road operation, material movements, temporary pond works and water management were underway.
- Greatworth worksite (ref.: GW) where stockpile management, site access road maintenance, haul road operation, material movements, drainage, utility diversion works and bulk excavation were underway.
- Radstone and Hall Farm worksites (ref.: RA and ref.: HF) where stockpile management, site access and haul road maintenance and operation, bulk excavation, abutment and wingwall construction, drainage, sheet piling, culvert and parapet installation and backfilling were underway.

Further works where monitoring was not undertaken occurred at:

- A43 Compound worksite where workshop building erection was underway.
- A43M Highway Diversion worksite where de-vegetation and landscaping

works were underway.

• Helmdon Embankment where site access road construction was underway.

The HS2 threshold levels for significant noise impacts, which are defined in Information Paper E23 (<u>https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/hs2-information-papers-</u><u>environment</u>), were exceeded on seventeen (17) occasions due to HS2 works during April 2025.

There were no exceedances of trigger levels as defined in section 61 consents during the reporting period.

One (1) complaint regarding noise and vibration was received by HS2 during the monitoring period.

Decibel(s) A- weighted, or dB(A)	The human ear system does not respond uniformly to sound across the detectable frequency range and consequently instrumentation used to measure sound is weighted to represent the performance of the ear. This is known as the 'A weighting' and is written as 'dB(A)'.						
Equivalent continuous sound pressure level, or L _{Aeq,T}	An index used internationally for the assessment of environmental sound impacts. It is defined as the notional unchanging level that would, over a given period of time (T), deliver the same sound energy as the actual time-varying sound over the same period. Hence fluctuating sound levels can be described in terms of an equivalent single figure value, typically expressed as a decibel level.						
Exclusion of data	Measurement of noise levels can be affected by weather conditions such as prolonged periods of rain, winds speeds higher than 5m/s and snow/ice ground cover. Noise levels measured during these periods are considered not representative of normal noise conditions at the site and, for the purposes of this report, are excluded from the assessment of exceedances and calculation of typical noise levels and are also greyed out in charts. Identifiable incongruous noise and vibration events not attributable to HS2 construction noise are also excluded.						
Façade	A facade noise level is the noise level 1m in front of a large reflecting surface. The effect of reflection, is to produce a slightly higher (typically +3 dB) sound level than it would be if the reflecting surface was not there.						
Free-field	A free-field noise level is the noise level measured at a location where no reflective surfaces, other than the ground, lies within 3.5 metres of the microphone position.						
LOAEL	Lowest Observed Adverse Effect Level - the level above which adverse effects on health and quality of life can be detected.						
Peak particle velocity, or PPV	Instantaneous maximum velocity reached by a vibrating element as it oscillates about its rest position. The PPV is a simple indicator of perceptibility and risk of damage to structures due to vibration. It is usually measured in mm/s.						
SOAEL	Significant Observed Adverse Effect Level - the level above which significant adverse effects on health and quality of life occur.						
Sound pressure level	The parameter by which sound levels are measured in air. It is measured in decibels. The threshold of hearing has been set at 0dB, while the threshold of pain is approximately 120dB. Normal speech is approximately 60dB at a distance of 1 metre and a change of 3dB in a time varying sound signal is commonly regarded as being just detectable. A change of 10dB is subjectively twice, or half, as loud.						
Vibration dose value, or VDV	An index used to evaluate human exposure to vibration in buildings. While the PPV provides information regarding the magnitude of single vibration events, the VDV provides a measure of the total vibration experienced over a specified period of time (typically 16h daytime and 8h night-time). It takes into account the magnitude, the number and the duration of vibration events and can be used to quantify exposure to continuous, impulsive, occasional and intermittent vibration. The vibration dose value is measured in m/s ^{1.75} .						

1 Introduction

- 1.1.1 HS2 is required to undertake noise (and vibration) monitoring as necessary to comply with the requirements of the High Speed Rail (London-West Midlands) Environmental Minimum Requirements, including specifically Annex 1: Code of Construction Practice, in addition to any monitoring requirements arising from conditions imposed through consents under Section 61 of the Control of Pollution Act, 1974 or through Undertakings & Assurances given to third parties. Such monitoring may be undertaken for the following purposes:
 - monitoring the impact of construction works;
 - to investigate complaints, incidents and exceedance of trigger levels; or
 - monitoring the effectiveness of noise and vibration control measures.
- 1.1.2 Monitoring data and interpretive reports are to be provided to each relevant local authority on a monthly basis and shall include a summary of the construction activities occurring, the data recorded over the monitoring period, any complaints received, any periods in exceedance of agreed trigger levels, the results of any investigations and any actions taken or mitigation measures implemented. This report provides noise data, and interpretation thereof, for monitoring carried out by HS2 within the West Northamptonshire District Council (WNDC) area for the period 1st to 30th April 2025.
- 1.1.3 Active construction sites in the local authority area where monitoring was undertaken during this period include:
 - Fir Tree Nursery worksite, ref.: FTN (see Works Identification Plan 1 in Appendix A), where the following work activities were undertaken:
 - Topsoil stripping.
 - Stockpile management.

- 1.1.4 Further works where monitoring was not undertaken occurred at:
 - A43 Compound worksite where workshop building erection was underway.
 - A43M Highway Diversion worksite where de-vegetation and landscaping works were underway.
 - Helmdon Embankment where site access road construction was underway.

1.2 Measurement Locations

2 Summary of Results

2.1 Summary of Measured Noise Levels

2.1.1 Table 3 presents a summary of the measured noise levels at each monitoring location over the reporting period. The L_{Aeq,T} is presented for each of the relevant time periods averaged over the calendar month, along with the highest single period L_{Aeq,T} that was found to occur within the month.

2.1.2 Appendix C presents graphs of the noise monitoring data over the month for each of the measurement locations. Noise data presented consists of the hourly L_{Aeq} values and, where relevant, the L_{Aeq,T} values (where the time period T has been taken to be the averaging period as specified in Table 1 of HS2 Information Paper E23). 2.2 Exceedances of the LOAEL and SOAEL

- 2.2.1 The lowest observed adverse effect level (LOAEL) is defined in the Planning Practice Guidance – Noise (PPG) as the level above which "noise starts to cause small changes in behaviour and/or attitude, e.g. turning up volume of television; speaking more loudly; where there is no alternative ventilation, having to close windows for some of the time because of the noise. Potential for some reported sleep disturbance. Affects the acoustic character of the area such that there is a perceived change in the quality of life".
- 2.2.2 The significant observed adverse effect level (SOAEL) is defined in the 'Planning Practice Guidance – Noise' as the level above which "noise causes a material change in behaviour and/or attitude, e.g. avoiding certain activities during periods of intrusion; where there is no alternative ventilation, having to keep windows closed most of the time because of the noise. Potential for sleep disturbance resulting in difficulty in getting to sleep, premature awakening and difficulty in getting back to sleep. Quality of life diminished due to change in acoustic character of the area."
- 2.2.3 HS2 Phase One Information Paper E23: Control of Construction Noise and Vibration sets out the LOAELs and SOAELs for construction noise.
- 2.2.4 Where reported construction noise levels exceed the LOAEL and SOAEL, relevant periods will be identified. Summary statistics to evaluate ongoing qualification for noise insulation and temporary rehousing are also presented where relevant.
- 2.2.5 Table 4 presents a summary of recorded exceedances of the LOAEL and SOAEL at each measurement location over the reporting period, including the number of exceedances during each time period.

- 2.2.6 There were exceedances of the LOAEL due to HS2 construction works at five (5) monitoring locations during weekday daytime and evening, Saturday afternoon, Sunday and night periods.
- 2.2.7 There were exceedances of the SOAEL due to HS2 construction works at two (2) monitoring locations during Saturday afternoon, Sunday and night periods.
- 2.2.8 For the purpose of assessing eligibility for noise insulation or temporary rehousing, multiple exceedances of the SOAEL in a 24-hour period would be counted as a single exceedance during that day. Over the reporting period, the overall number of SOAEL exceedances at each measurement location is shown in Table 5and may be lower than the total sum of individual exceedances reported in Table 4 for each location.
