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Dear Chief Executives,

We are writing to confirm the Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) proposal development contributions for Surrey. Following the Statutory Invitation Letter dated 5 February 2025, the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) has agreed to allocate funding of £380,734 to support the development of local government reorganisation proposals in Surrey.

The agreed funds for the financial year 2025/26 will be issued as a single, non-ringfenced grant payment under Section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003, with conditions outlined in the Grant Determination. Payments will be sent by BACs by 16 July. Any monitoring or assurance activities for the grant will be conducted through existing, or standard practices. The allocation for 2025/26, detailed in Annex A, is based on the funding allocation methodology outlined by Jim McMahon MP OBE, Minister of State for Local Government and English Devolution, through a Written Ministerial Statement (WMS) on 3 June.

Surrey has collectively agreed for the grant to be paid to:

• Runnymede Borough Council: £190,367.00

• Surrey County Council: £190,367.00

It is the responsibility of the nominated councils' Section 151 officers to determine eligible expenditure. This expenditure should be agreed upon by all relevant councils and used solely for activities related to developing local government reorganisation proposals, in alignment with the statutory criteria, which has been further restated through the recent WMS and our letter on 3 June.

Grant Determination and Annex A - Financial Allocations

LGR PROPOSAL DEVELOPMENT CONTRIBUTIONS GRANT DETERMINATION (2025/26): No 31/7930

Jim McMahon MP OBE, Minister of State for Local Government and English Devolution ("the Minister of State"), in exercise of the powers conferred by section 31 of the Local Government Act 2003, makes the following determination:

Citation

1) This determination may be cited as the LGR Proposal Development Contributions Determination (25/26) [No31/7930].

Purpose of the grant

2) The purpose of the grant is to provide support to local authorities in England towards expenditure lawfully incurred or to be incurred by them.

Determination

3) The Minister of State determines as the authorities to which grant is to be paid and the amount of grant to be paid, the authorities and the amounts set out in Annex A.

Treasury consent

4) Before making this determination in relation to local authorities in England, the Minister of State obtained the consent of the Treasury.

UK Government Branding

- 5) The Grant Recipient shall at all times during and following the end of the Funding Period: 5.1 comply with requirements of the Branding Manual in relation to the Funded Activities: and
 - 5.2 cease use of the Funded by UK Government logo on demand if directed to do so by the Minister of State.
- 6) **Branding Manual** means the HM Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland 'Funded by UK Government branding manual' first published by the Cabinet Office in November 2022 and is available at https://gcs.civilservice.gov.uk/guidance/marketing/branding-guidelines/ including any subsequent updates from time to time].
