Thank you for your request for information which was processed in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You requested the following information:

I'm contacting you from CoStar, we track the commercial property market.

We've had information come through to us from HM Land Registry stating that the Carleton Clinic in Carlisle has been sold by Cumberland Council for £16,907,894. As Homes England have a proposed development of 157 homes opposite, we were looking to clarify if yourselves have also bought Carleton Clinic and are intending to redevelop this site.

We also provide recognition for commercial real estate agents so were there any agents involved that we could provide credit for?

Response

We can confirm that Homes England does not hold the information detailed in your request.
