The Castor Common, greenfield site proposal for 5000+ houses runs against the stated Homes England strategy



Peterborough is top of the list of the UK's 20 Least Healthy Areas and large isolated housing developments will increase the stress on both healthcare and social services.

Topping the list as the least healthy area of the United Kingdom, Peterborough finds itself lackluster due to poor air quality with high levels of PM2.5. Its mean is 7, which could contribute to other findings, such as the high cancer rate (28.7% of the population in the city).

Why is the air quality poor? Traffic, livestock manure, industrial emissions, and wood burners all play a role in the <u>poorer-than-average air quality</u> that sits above the level set by the World Health Organisation (WHO). Perhaps in part due to the poor air quality, only a little over half of all adults in the city are physically active, 57.4% of the population, and 60.7% of adults are overweight or obese based on the BMI index.

Growth options presented in recent growth consultation did not include brownfield as an option, despite Homes England Brownfield Strategy

Peterborough has a huge need for urban regeneration and a large amount of 'Greyfield' location in the centre of town - many are used for single use, low value, car parking.

Affordable housing is a serious issue for the city, building remote stand alone settlements with no work or city services and expensive travel costs will not work for lower income population

This type of greenfield development does not fit with legal obligations of Paris Agreement - it is <u>estimated that the UK could only build 14000</u> <u>homes per year</u>

Describing a development with upward of 5000 houses as 'linked villages' is disingenuous greenwashing - recent developments of this size in Cambridgeshire have all failed to provide adequate community services requiring extensive car travel for everyday things.

The priority for homes in the UK is not for stranded housing estates in rural locations, rather it is for affordable homes in cities where work is available and the cost of living is low (e.g. walkable, cycleable, easy to heat/cool) with good access to healthcare, social care and education services.

This Homes England site does none of these things, yet is being actively pushed forward

In addition the city council needs to lower the cost of providing quality public services. Urban sprawl increases the cost of providing every type of city service - infrastructure, cost of transport and inefficient use of time.

When the UK is struggling with food security and affordable food, building on good agricultural land is folly.

The recent 'Viability Assessment' for the site is not fit for purpose since it only considers developer profitability and omits both the significant infrastructure costs to develop the site, omits the increased flood risk and sewer overflows it would create for both local villages and the city of Peterborough from surface water flooding and does not account for the future financial liability a site like this would create for the city council.

The Homes England does not reflect community priorities

The proposed Homes England site was specifically rejected in the current local plan, it was overwhelmingly rejected in the 2024 consultation about growth options and this area already has a landscape-scale plan supported by major land owners, local parish councils, many local organisation and most residents.





A vital priority for Peterborough in the next 5 to 10 years is to work on coastal resilience, we have been lucky (so far) with surface water flooding and storm water surges in the North Sea

Puzzling...

- In the recent tender document there is a clear presumption that the site will be developed at all costs, it just needs to be pushed through.
- There is significant doubt even about the Homes England title over the site.
- Homes England is spending hundreds of thousands of pounds on pushing an unviable site that has been rejected 4 times when the city of Peterborough that is in need of regeneration growth in its existing urban areas, in particular in the city centre.
- The true cost of ownership for remote greenfield developments is unaffordable for Peterborough city council the site creates a huge future liability for city services at a time when it has no funds. The very reason cities emerge is because they are designed to be efficient and productive places to live this runs counter to how cities develop. Paste peterborough developments of this kind have not brought prosperity.
- The manor of the Homes England aggressive, repeated push for the site has the hallmarks of the Grenfell Scandal and the Post Office Scandal:
 - A high level of arrogance while pushing a solution that has not worked in the past
 - Lack of involvement from local people with significant knowledge
 - Pushing harder when evidence is inconvenient and the game is all about meeting numbers
