"it is essential that you make the details of all relevant policies freely available on your websites in a clear and accessible manner."

## Advice and Assistance

We have a duty to provide advice and assistance in accordance with Section 16 of the FOIA. To comply with this duty, we are able to confirm there was no e-mail correspondence or meeting minutes of communication between Homes England and providers relating to the updated guidance quoted in your request.

The updates to the Capital Funding Guide were made alongside and as a result of the letter published by the then Secretary of State for the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (now the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government).

The letter you specify in your request was prepared by the Secretary of State and department officials with Homes England merely ensuring that the letter and the Homes England updates to the Capital Funding Guide guidance were aligned.

Homes England's role was limited to implementation of the changes. As this was a published letter to affordable housing providers from the Secretary of State, Homes England took the view that any additional direct communication with providers was not necessary.

## **Right to Appeal**

If you are not happy with the information that has been provided or the way in which your request has been handled, you may request an internal review. You can request an internal review by writing to Homes England via the details below, quoting the reference number at the top of this letter.

Your request for review must be made in writing, explain why you wish to appeal, and be received within 40 working days of the date of this response. Failure to meet this criteria may lead to your request being refused.

Upon receipt, your request for review will be passed to an independent party not involved in your original request. We aim to issue a response within 20 working days.

You may also complain to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) however, the Information Commissioner does usually expect the internal review procedure to be exhausted in the first instance.
