RE: Request for Information - RFI5254

Thank you for your request for information which was processed under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (EIR).

You requested the following information:

We have lived in the same house from the above proposed development of Tunbridge Wells Rugby Football Club's land for 35 years. We object to the proposal on many grounds along with the majority of residents in this area.

I have had my attention drawn to a document alleging that Homes England has funded the developers of this site some £10million.

As you are a government agency I find this to be most surprising and therefore seek Homes England's assurance that no government funds have been or will be provided for the above proposed development.

Your colleague, who picked up my call this last hour, told me I should e-mail Homes England seeking confirmation or not, failing that an explanation of what has taken place in terms of said funding.

Response

We can confirm that we do hold the requested information. We can confirm that Homes England have acquired the freehold of a parcel of land adjoining Bayham Road (title number ESX326059) through the Land Assembly Fund to support housing delivery for the area. The land acquired is proposed for allocation for housing in the draft Wealden local plan.

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We can confirm the purchase price of the land was £10 million. The land has been sold subject to contract to Esquire developments, who intend to bring forward the land as part of a wider development proposal for the area and will be bringing forward a planning application shortly, with the final detail currently being prepared. Comments and objections to the development can be made to the local planning authority as part of the normal due consideration of the planning application once the full detail is available.
