Notes to the Accounts – Solidarity Union

Basis of Preparation The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with UK GAAP (FRS 102) under the historical cost convention. The accounts are presented on a going concern basis.

Income Recognition Membership subscriptions and levies are recognized on an accrual basis, reflecting amounts received within the financial year. Donations and other income streams are accounted for when receivable. Investment income is recorded when earned.

Expenditure and Liabilities Administrative expenses, legal fees, and governance costs are recognized when incurred. Accruals are made for outstanding obligations, including staff remuneration. Provisions are recognized for any anticipated liabilities where applicable.

Fixed Assets and Depreciation Furniture and office equipment are depreciated using the straight-line method at a rate of 20% per annum, spreading costs evenly over five years. Other assets, such as software or property, follow their respective depreciation schedules in line with expected useful life. No revaluations have been applied, and assets remain recorded under the historical cost convention.

Underpayment of Wages – General Secretary During the financial year, the General Secretary was entitled to £9,217.52 in wages but was paid £8,286.34, resulting in an

underpayment of £931.18. At the end of the year, the General Secretary chose to write off the outstanding amount, and no liability remains in the accounts.

Missed Payment from Previous Year A payment of £10 was missed in last year's accounts, which has resulted in a difference between the closing balance for the previous year and the opening balance for this year. However, this adjustment makes no material difference to the financial position of the union.

Rounding of Figures in AR21 Form Figures reported in the AR21 form have been rounded as per Certification Office guidelines, which may result in minor numerical differences when compared with precise underlying financial records.

Political Fund Statement Solidarity Union does not have a Political Fund and has never had one.

Investments For the financial year 2025, the union held no investments.

Compliance with Trade Union Legislation These accounts comply with the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992. The union affirms transparency in financial reporting as required by the Certification Office.

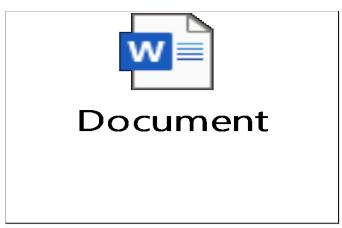
