The requirements set out in AH/T160B shall not apply to consignments intended for processing establishments authorised in accordance with the Aquatic Animal Health (England and Wales) Regulations 2009 or the Aquatic Animal Health (Scotland) Regulation 2009 for the relevant disease(s), or for dispatch centres, purification centres or similar businesses which are equipped with an effluent treatment system that inactivates the relevant pathogens, or where the effluent is subject to other types of treatment that reduce the risk of transmitting disease to the natural waters to an acceptable level.
