

In-ovo sexing on days 12 and 13


Works for **all breeds** (white, colored, brown)

No-Kill Eggs Value Chain

At 1 ct/egg price increase, consumers and retailers can stop the culling of male chicks.





European Retailers

Marketing campaigns in Europe have caught consumer attention.

European retailers launched the campaign "Ohne Kükentöten" (translates to: without culling of chicks) due to pressure from the society, accelerated by regulatory changes.

Culling of male day-old chicks has been banned in Germany since January 2022 and will be banned in France starting January 2023.
