## Notice under section 52 of the Water Resources Act 1991 (as amended by the Water Act 2003)

## Notice of a proposal to revoke (cancel) a licence to abstract water, licence number 28/39/28/104

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with Section 52 of the Water Resources Act 1991 (as amended by Section 22 of the Water Act 2003) and Regulation 31 of the Water Resources (Abstraction and Impounding) Regulations 2006, that the Environment Agency has made a proposal to revoke a licence to abstract water, licence number 28/39/28/104.

This licence allows the licence holder: Affinity Water Limited, Tamblin Way, Hatfield, Hertfordshire, AL10 9EZ to abstract a total of 386 cubic meters (m3) an hour, 7,092 cubic metres (m3) of water a day, and a total of 1,905,723m3 a year, from the River Chess at Alma Road. This is at National Grid Reference (NGR) SP 96200 02600. The licence holder can abstract water for Public Water Supply.

The proposal is to revoke the abstraction licence
