

DECLARATION OF SPECIAL MEASURES: IMPORTATION OF ANIMAL CASINGS FROM SUSCEPTIBLE ANIMALS FROM ESWATINI AND SLOVAKIA

THE TRADE IN ANIMALS AND RELATED PRODUCTS (WALES) REGULATIONS 2011 (SI 2011/2379 (W. 252))

The Welsh Ministers have reasonable grounds for suspecting the existence of foot-and-mouth disease in Eswatini and Slovakia such that animal casings from susceptible animals originating in Eswatini and Slovakia are liable to pose a risk to animal health.

Under regulation 29(1) of the Trade in Animals and Related Products (Wales) Regulations 2011¹, the Welsh Ministers declare the following special measures to be necessary in Wales in order to contain the risk to animal health.

Amendment of the existing declaration

1. The Declaration of Special Measures: Importation of animal casings from susceptible animals from certain third countries and territories made by the Welsh Ministers on 16 January 2025² (“the Declaration”) is amended in accordance with paragraph 2.
2. In the Declaration—
 - a. in Annex 1, in the table—
 - i. omit “27. Eswatini”;
 - ii. omit “67. Slovakia”; and
 - iii. insert “78. Germany”.

Interpretation

3. In this Declaration—
 - a. “animal casings” means intestines and bladders that, after cleaning, have been processed by tissue scraping, defatting and washing, and have been treated with salt; and
 - b. “susceptible animals” means bovine, ovine, caprine or porcine animals.

Revocation of previous measures

4. The “Declaration of Special Measures: Importation of Animal Casings from Susceptible Animals from Eswatini, Hungary and Slovakia” made by the Welsh Ministers on 24 June 2025 is revoked.

Coming into force of the Declaration

5. The revocation in paragraph 4 and the special measures in this Declaration come into force on the day following the day on which the Declaration is made.
