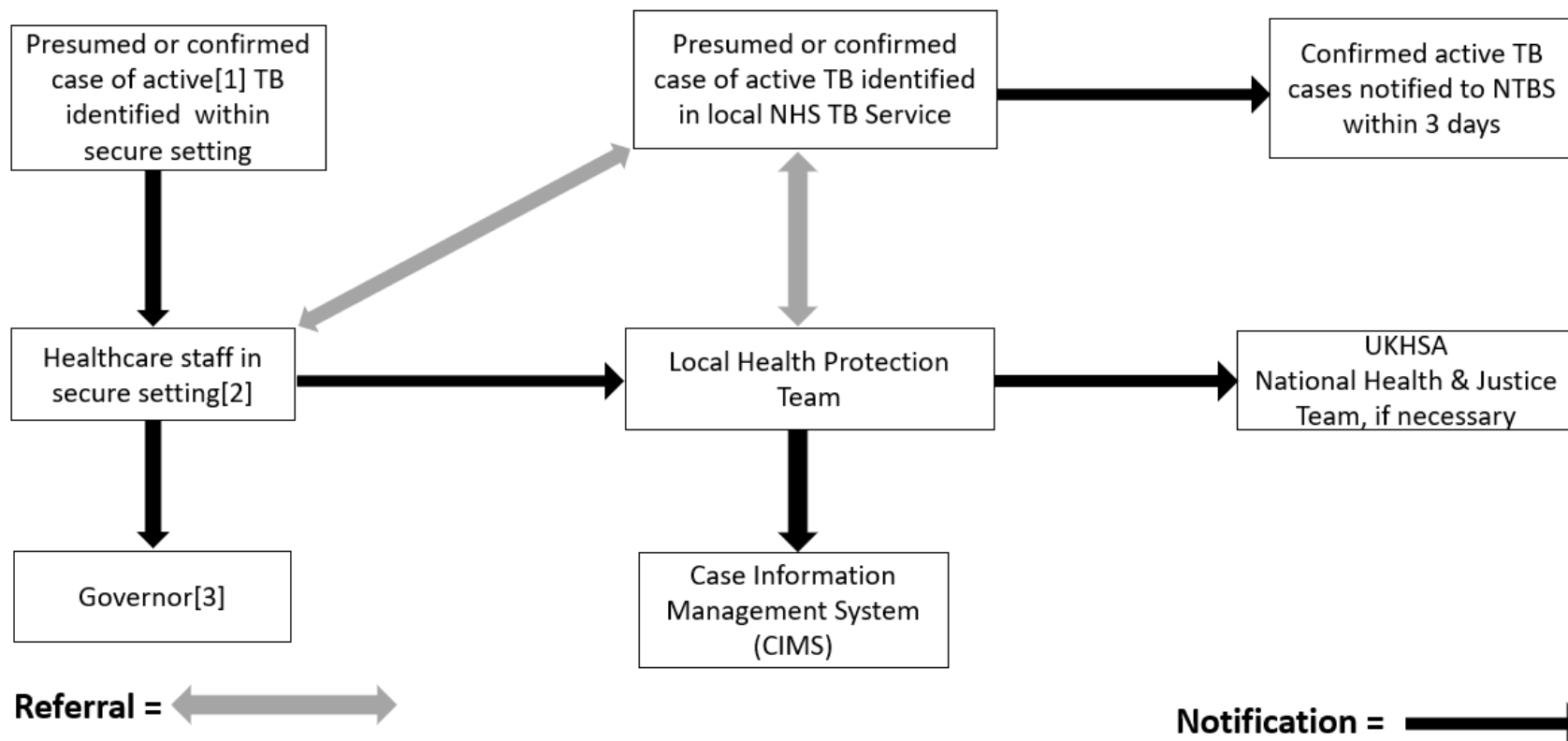




Appendix 7: Possible Notification Routes for individuals with TB resident in secure settings
