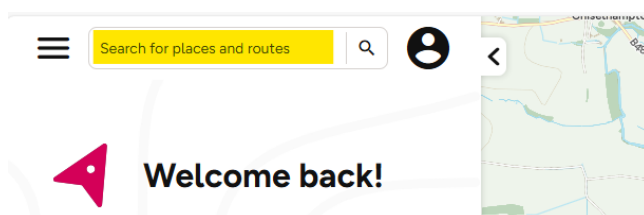
Use this form to add all land/buildings you intend to keep livestock on under a TLA or tCPH.

How to find an OS grid reference

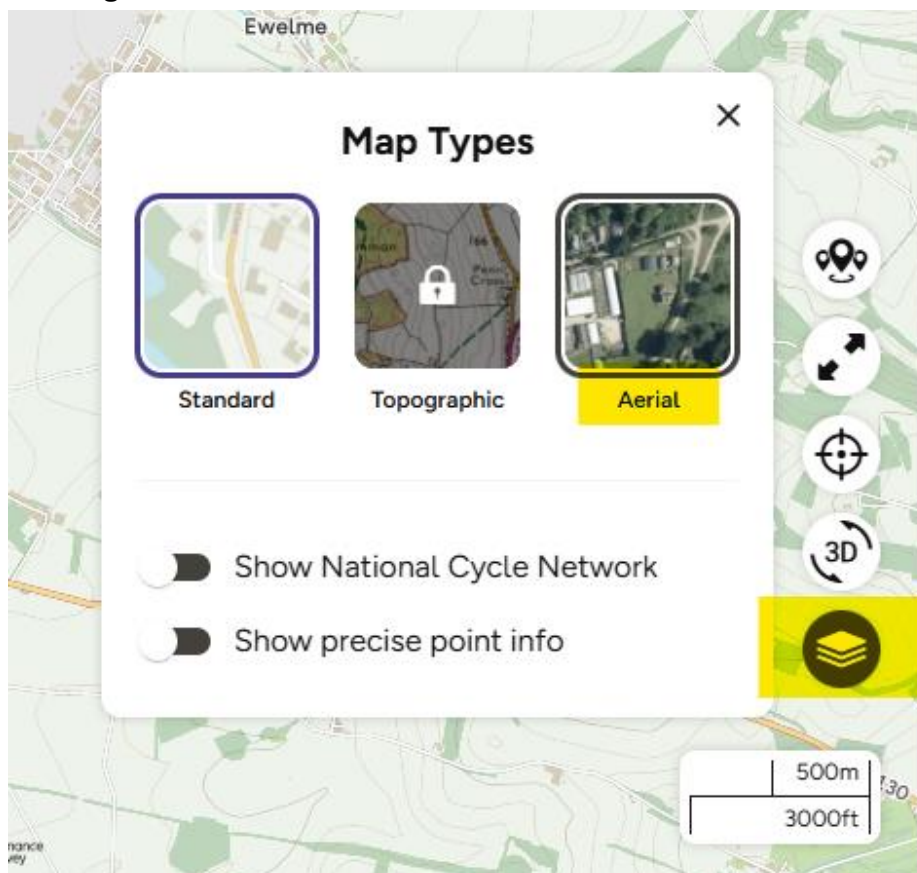
For each field or building, you must give an Ordnance Survey (OS) grid reference. This is 12 characters - 2 letters followed by 10 numbers.

Use the [Ordnance Survey](#). Follow these instructions.

1. Search for a county, place or postcode to locate the geographic location of the fields or buildings you are applying for.



2. Switch the map layer to Aerial View to more easily identify individual fields and buildings.



3. To find a specific field or building on the map, click and hold the left mouse button to drag and move around. You can zoom in or out using either the '+' and '-' icons or by scrolling with the middle mouse wheel.

- Right click on each individual building or field to find the OS grid reference.



How to provide a parcel ID

You can also provide a parcel ID for fields (not buildings) instead of an OS grid reference if the landowner has given you this. A parcel ID is a unique 10-character ID number given to a land parcel when it's registered with the Rural Payments service (for example, ST 6789 6789).

Do not use Magic Maps to find grid references for this form. A land parcel ID is not the same as a National Grid field reference number, which you may have used when applying for a CPH number.
