#### LIGHT DUES

### The Straight Point Exeter Light Dues Order, 1950

Made -21st December, 1950 Laid before Parliament Of December, 1950 1st January, 1951. Coming into Operation

Buckingham Palace ,the twenty-first day of December, 1950 At the Court at Present:

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by Section 655 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894(a), it is (amongst other things) provided that if any lighthouse, buoy or beacon is erected or placed or reconstructed, repaired or replaced by a local lighthouse authority His Majesty may, on the application of that authority, by Order in Council, fix such dues to be paid to that authority in respect of every ship which enters the port or harbour under the control of that authority or the estuary in which the lighthouse, buoy or beacon is situate and which passes the lighthouse, buoy or beacon and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may think reasonable:

And Whereas the Straight Point Light has been erected as a lighthouse by the Exeter Corporation—being a local lighthouse authority within the meaning of the said Section—and the said Corporation has made application that dues may be fixed in respect of the said lighthouse:

Now therefore His Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered

- 1. On and after the first day of January, 1951, there shall be paid to the Exeter Corporation in respect of every ship which shall enter the Port of Exeter and pass the Straight Point Light and derive benefit therefrom, the dues specified in the Schedule hereto.
- 2. The Interpretation Act, 1889(b), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Straight Point Exeter Light Dues Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the first day of January. 195

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#### **SCHEDULE**

For every cargo ship under 100 tons register.

For every cargo ship from 100 to 150 tons register.

For every cargo ship from 150 to 200 tons register.

For every cargo ship from 200 to 250 tons register.

For every cargo ship from 250 tons register and over
Fishing vessels registered within the Port—10s. annual charge.

Passenger ships under 50 tons register—10s. annual charge.

Passenger ships over 50 tons register—£1 annual charge.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE '

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

Under Section 655 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, if a local lighthouse authority erect a lighthouse, buoy or beacon, they may be authorised by Order in Council to levy dues in respect of ships benefiting therefrom. A lighthouse has been erected at Straight Point, Exeter, by the Exeter Corporation as a local lighthouse authority, and the purpose of this Order is to confer power on the Corporation to levy such dues and to fix the scale thereof.
