About the campaign

The **firework safety campaign** aims to increase public awareness of the safe and considerate use of fireworks across England and Wales, building on the success of the 2024 campaign.

The campaign highlights both the **legal penalties** and **injury risks** associated with the misuse of fireworks, encouraging responsible behaviour and safer celebrations at private displays. By combining safety guidance with targeted messaging around the law, the campaign seeks to reduce firework-related injuries and antisocial behaviour during key seasonal periods.

Target audiences:

- Consumers planning to use fireworks in private displays
- Teenagers (13 to 18 years old), focusing on raising awareness of penalties and the potential for life-changing injuries

Campaign dates:

- Main activity: 15 October to 7 November
- Key events: Diwali (20 October) and Bonfire Night (5 November)
- Additional rollout: 26 to 31 December

Planning to use fireworks at home?

If you're aged 18 or over, you're legally allowed to buy fireworks for private use, but safety comes first. Make sure you have enough garden space to use them responsibly and keep everyone (including pets!) safe.

Make sure you purchase from reputable retailers and always check the packaging for the UKCA or CE mark, it's your sign that the fireworks meet safety standards.

Be considerate of your neighbours, fireworks can be distressing for some people, including pets and those with sensory sensitivities. A little thought goes a long way.

Be mindful of your neighbours, they may have pets who find fireworks distressing. A little consideration can go a long way in keeping the whole community safe and comfortable.

If you're planning a display near farmland or stables, it's important to let nearby farms know in advance so they can take steps to protect their animals.

If you're using fireworks at home, take steps to reduce their stress, give pets extra bedding and nesting material so they can burrow and feel secure.


The following assets and example social media posts are designed for 13 to 18 year olds. They focus on raising awareness of both the legal consequences and safety risks linked to firework misuse.

Keep yourself and your mates out of trouble:





Keep yourself and your mates safe:


- always read the instructions


Don't let one night haunt your future. Remember, it's illegal to:






