

Certificate for importation, possession and supply of veterinary medicines in Northern Ireland

NORTHERN IRELAND CERTIFICATE No: 1/2025

In accordance with regulations 25(5), 26(3) and 27(2) of the Veterinary Medicines Regulations 2013 (the “2013 Regulations”) this certificate authorises the import, possession and supply of veterinary medicinal products in Northern Ireland subject to the following conditions:

1. The product is imported into Northern Ireland from Great Britain and holds a current Marketing Authorisation in Great Britain.
2. The product is imported and supplied for the purpose of administration under the cascade as set out in Articles 112, 113 and 114 of Regulation (EU) 2019/6.
3. There is no suitable medicinal product available that is authorised in Northern Ireland or an EU Member State.
4. The veterinary surgeon who prescribes the product;
 - a) before doing so, must be satisfied that the person who will use the product is competent to do so safely, and intends to use it for a purpose for which it is prescribed;
 - b) when doing so, must advise on its safe administration and on any warnings or contra-indications on the label or package leaflet;
 - c) must not prescribe more than the minimum amount required for the treatment.
5. Unless the veterinary surgeon who prescribed the product both supplies it and administers it to the animal;
 - a) the prescription must be a written prescription that complies with paragraph 6 of Schedule 3 to the 2013 Regulations;
 - b) the person supplying the product must label it (or ensure that it is labelled) with the information set out in paragraph 13(2) of Schedule 3 to the 2013 Regulations.

6. Any veterinary surgeon or pharmacist who receives or supplies the product must keep a record of the information relating to the transaction listed under regulation 23(1) of the 2013 Regulations for at least 5 years.
