Funding Simplification – Explanatory Tables

We are simplifying the local government funding landscape through three primary mechanisms:

- 1. Bringing together the Levelling Up Fund, Town Deals, and the Pathfinder Pilots into a single Local Regeneration Fund as the first step to simplify capital funding.
- 2. Bringing together funding into four high-value consolidated grants.
- 3. Consolidating funding directly into the Revenue Support Grant (RSG).

This table sets out how revenue funding is being simplified. Some revenue funding is being delivered through the Settlement for the first time, while some is existing Settlement funding which we are taking the opportunity to rationalise. The following tables provide a breakdown of each funding stream; how they are being consolidated; whether they are new or existing Settlement funding; and whether they are in Core Spending Power (CSP).

All figures below are over the multi-year Local Government Finance Settlement (2026-27 to 2028-29), expressed in billions and have been rounded to two decimal places.
