Carer's Allowance is a benefit for people who provide regular and substantial care to a disabled person for at least 35 hours a week, and meet certain eligibility criteria.

Normally, you can expect us to get back to you within 6 weeks. This may change at busy times of the year.

Remember

If someone else also cares for the same person as you, only one of you can claim a carer's benefit. This could be Carer's Allowance, Carer Support Payment or, for those in receipt of Universal Credit, an extra amount for caring for someone.

If you both meet the criteria, you must try to decide between you who will claim. If you cannot decide on who this should be, the Department for Work and Pensions will make the decision.
