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Objection to Bristol City application 25/14638/PINS

1. The evening use of the pitches will increase the noise level to adjacent houses, particularly on clear winter nights when sound travels farther. The original sound survey stated that if floodlights were ever considered then noise mitigation measures must be included. There is no limit stated on hours of use. The current limits are often exceeded by unauthorised late evening use as the school has failed to lock the pitches outside of normal hours, something they had promised to do on their original planning applications for these pitches.

2. Intrusive lighting is already a problem from the school grounds at night. Bedrooms in particular are directly opposite and already suffer from light shining in from the grounds. Further lighting will be intolerable and no time limits have yet been proposed. If there were to be more lights on all night it would encourage further unauthorised use.

As an additional comment the original hedge and tree planting was damaged by pupils. What provision is there for future maintenance of trees and shrubs?
