S62A/2025/0133 Stoke Lodge Playing Fields, West Dene, Shirehampton, Bristol BS9 2BH

I have a serious objection to the installation of eight poles housing 24 cameras with 360-degree day and night vision over the surrounding area, particularly as my house and garden are directly on the boundary. My garden, two bedroom windows and our bathroom window are in the direct view of two ([REDACTED]) of the triple camera systems – albeit partly shielded in the summer when the trees have leaves. Currently there is no obstacle to the proposed field view. I regard this as a potential gross invasion of privacy, which has a major detriment on personal environment. There is no information in the application of which observations that affect my home, will be conveyed to me, nor any mention of controls over access to the output of the system, or what use will be made of the material.

Additionally, whether Cotham accept it or not, Bristol City Council have agreed that there are four rights of way, which existed long before Cotham were allowed to use the field. Until such time as the Planning Inspectorate reject the Council finding, the continued construction of obstructions and surveillance equipment should be paused. Restricting access and adding surveillance also contravenes the terms of Cotham's lease which specifically requires Cotham to allow continuing use of the field by the community.
