

Introduction



If you need extra help claiming benefits, the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) may be able to visit you in person.



If you are eligible for a visit, DWP will arrange one for you.

You cannot book a visit yourself.



Arranging your visit



Visits can be at:

- Your home
- hospitals
- care homes

Or one of our visiting places.



A voluntary organisation like Citizens Advice or Age UK can also refer you for a visit.



We may arrange a visit if you:

- have complex needs or a disability
- are a vulnerable young person claiming for the first time
- have no one else to support you and you cannot claim benefits any other way.



We may also arrange a visit if someone is applying to help you manage your benefits.

We call this person an appointee.



Once a visit is agreed, our Visiting Team will call you to book an appointment. They will tell you:

- the date
- time
- location of the visit.



They also tell you:

- who will visit
- what documents you need
- the security and safety arrangements.

Letter

After the phone call, you will be sent a letter confirming the visit details.



You will also get a text message confirming the appointment, if you provided a mobile telephone number.



What happens when you have your visit



When the Visiting Officer arrives, they will show you their photo ID card.


Letter

The name on their ID card will be the same as the name on your letter or text message.

Information

The length of a visit can vary depending on the information needed.



Visits can last for 30 minutes or up to 2 hours.
