Dear Sir

I am writing to object to the proposed installation of cameras. Although I do not live immediately adjacent to the site, I am genuinely concerned about the wider planning implications and the impact this development could have on the character and privacy standards that Bristol City Council aims to protect.

The proposal appears to conflict with BCS21 (Quality Urban Design) and DM23 (Residential Amenity). The introduction of overt surveillance equipment is visually intrusive and out of keeping with the surrounding area, harming the overall character and streetscape. Bristol City Council policy is clear that development should enhance, not undermine, the local environment.

I am also concerned about the potential loss of privacy for nearby residents. The angles and reach of the cameras have not been clearly demonstrated, and without this clarity, there is a real risk that neighbouring homes and gardens could be captured. The lack of proper justification or assessment makes the proposal feel disproportionate and poorly thought-through.

Overall, the installation of these cameras does not meet the expectations of Bristol's Local Plan and creates unnecessary concern for residents.

I respectfully ask the Council to refuse this application.
