I object to this application because:

Overdevelopment & Visual Impact

The proposal to erect 8 x 6 meter high camera poles represents a huge overdevelopment of this heritage parkland site. These poles would destroy the visual appeal of this lovely, green space, making it look more like a concentration camp. The views across the fields, and of the mature trees would be destroyed. This development would be completely inappropriate and unsympathetic to the Adult Education Centre building and its associated parkland as a whole.

Amenity & Public Rights of Way

The impact on amenity would be hugely detrimental. The fields are an oasis in an urban area, providing a feel of the countryside and a soothing connection to nature. As a regular user of the Adult Learning Centre, poles 4 and 5 would directly inhibit use of the access paths for me. Walking on the Public Rights of Way across the parkland, I already feel uncomfortable and threatened by the hostile-looking security structures recently installed on the field. How much more intimidating would it be with an additional 24 cameras around the field recording every movement?

Please reject this planning proposal which would completely destroy the peaceful amenity and visual delight of Stoke Lodge Playing fields.
